Methodology & Sample Profile

This study was conducted by AtlasIntel, an independent research & data intelligence firm.


1100 random interviews of New Hampshire registered voters were conducted online between February 8 and February 10 2020. The sample was post-stratified with propensity scores to match the profile of registered voters on the following variables: gender, region, age group, education, family income, race, and vote in the 2016 Presidential Elections. The margin of error for registered voters is +/-3% at the 95% confidence level. The margin of error for likely Democratic primary voters is +/-5% at the 95% confidence level. 431 voters declared that they would be voting in the Democratic Primary.

State-level results are representative of registered voters. Democratic primary results are provided for likely voters. Some percentages do not add up to 100% due to rounding.

7 questions are not reported in this public report.








Do you think President Trump should be impeached and removed from office?

Which of these following Democratic primary candidates will you vote for?





Which of these following Democratic primary candidates will you vote for?



If the Democratic candidate was Bernie Sanders, whom would you vote for in the US presidential elections?










If the Democratic candidate was Joe Biden, whom would you vote for in the US presidential elections?
