The Maine Statewide Survey was conducted by IVR Interviews and Online Mobile from September 04 - September 07 among a random sample of 600 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.0 percentage points. Some percentages in crosstab and reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

The general election will take place in November of this year. How likely are you to vote in the November general election?

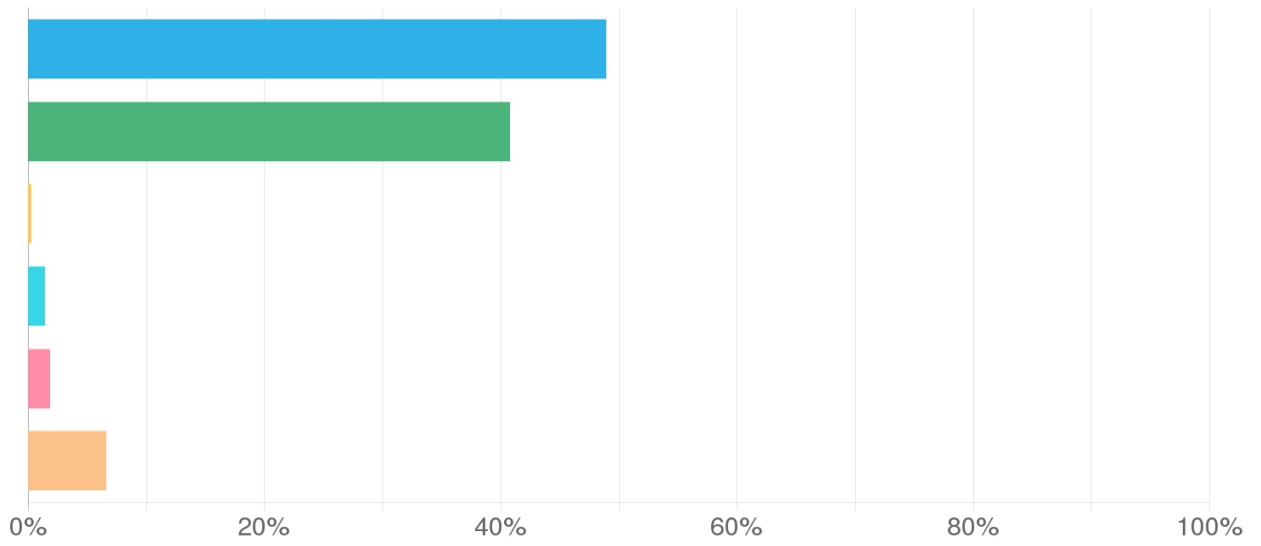


■ Somewhat likely to vote ■ Very likely to vote

If the election were held today, for whom would you vote for the U.S. Senate?

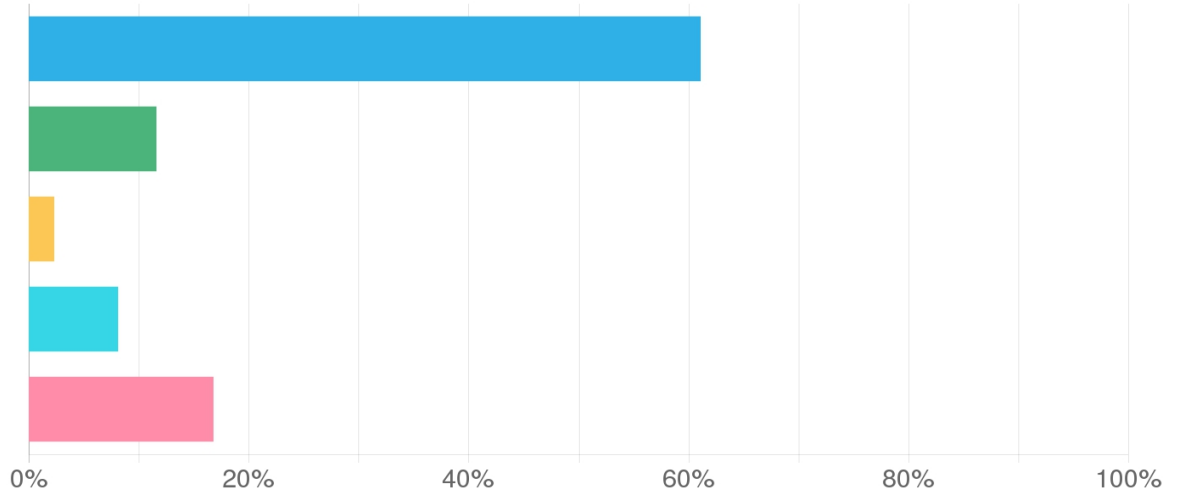

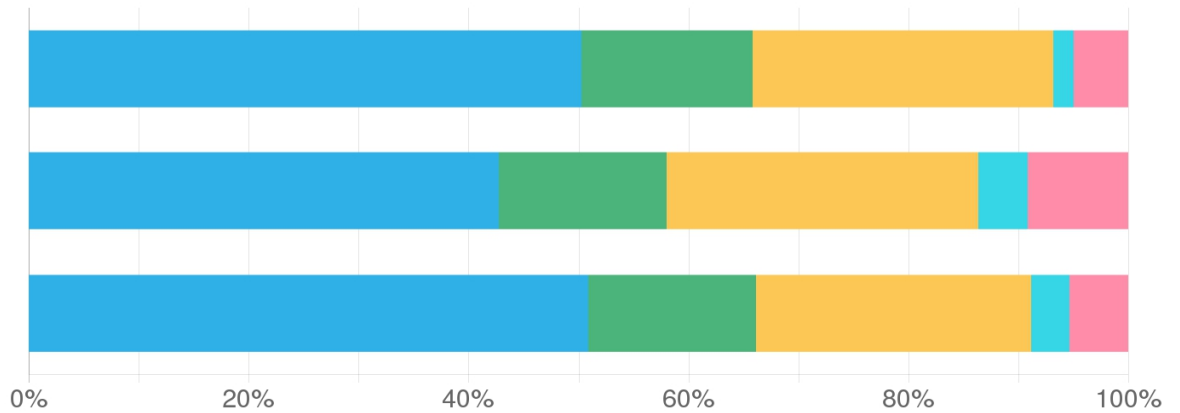

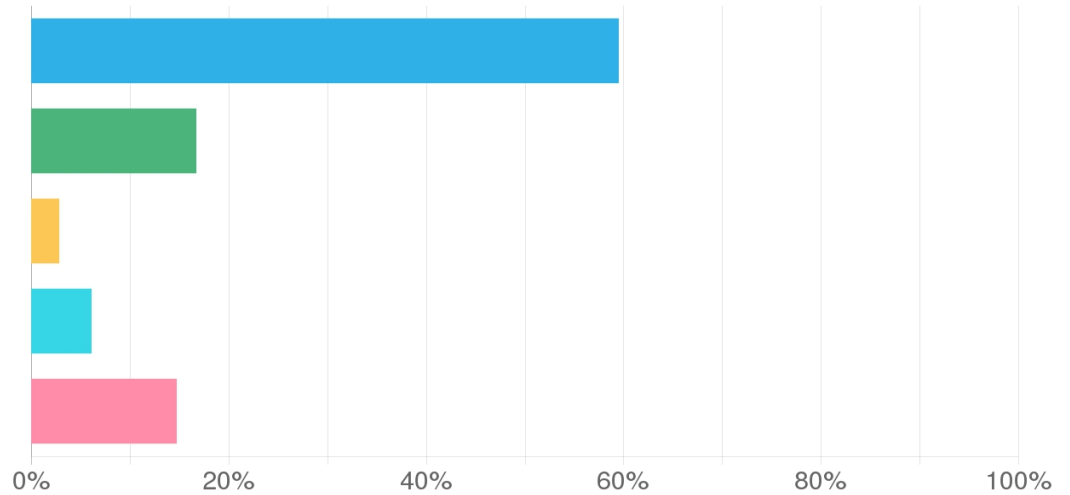

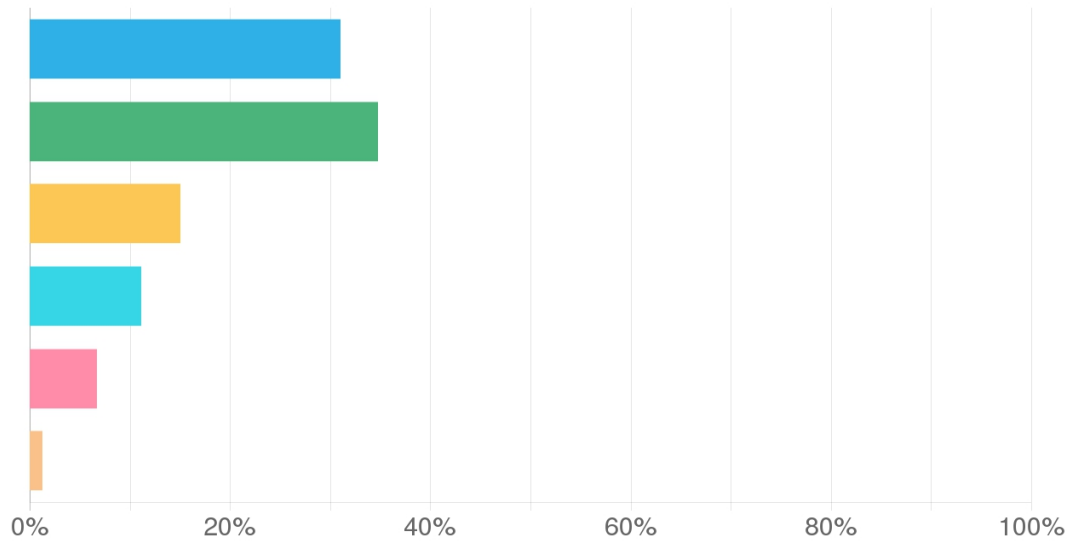

How do you identify politically?

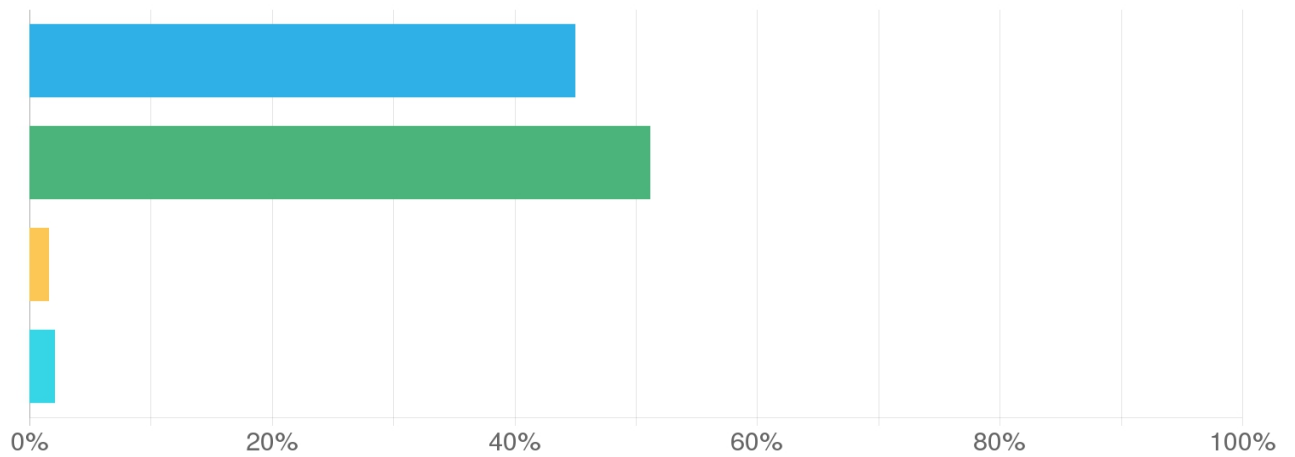

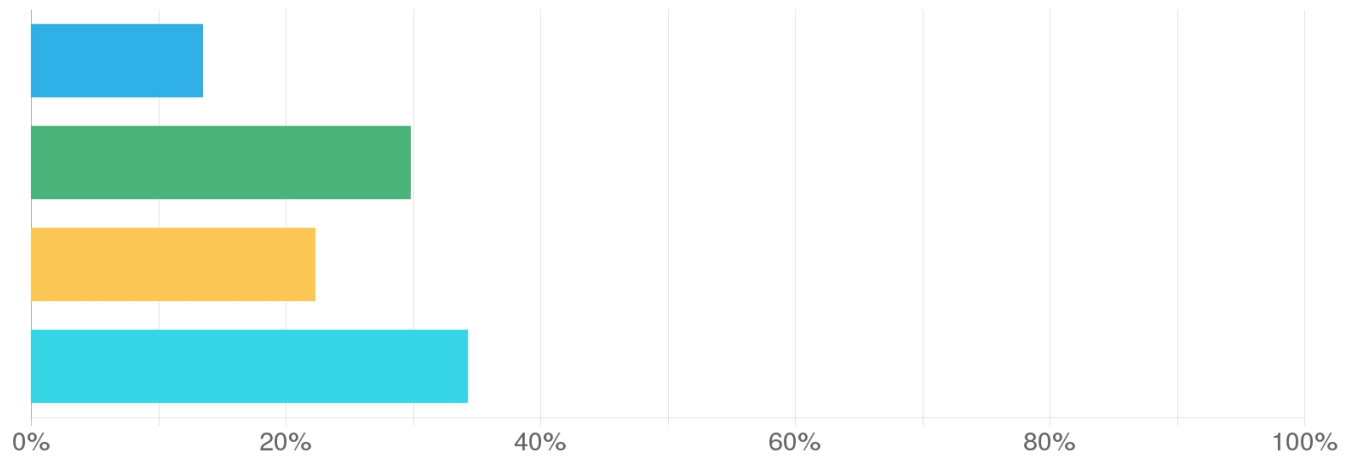

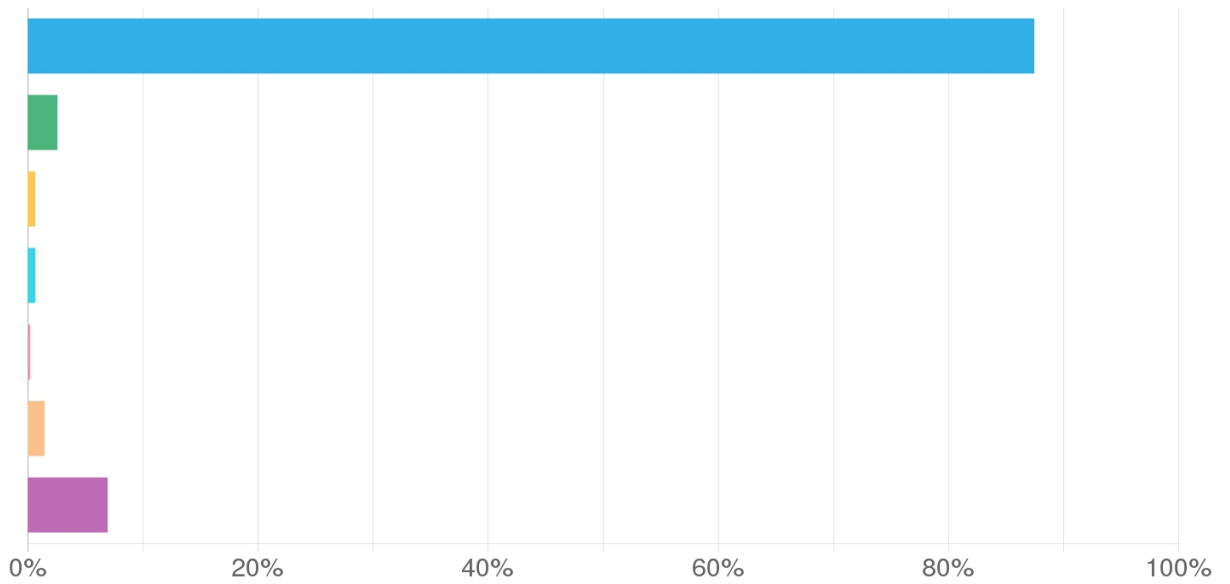
