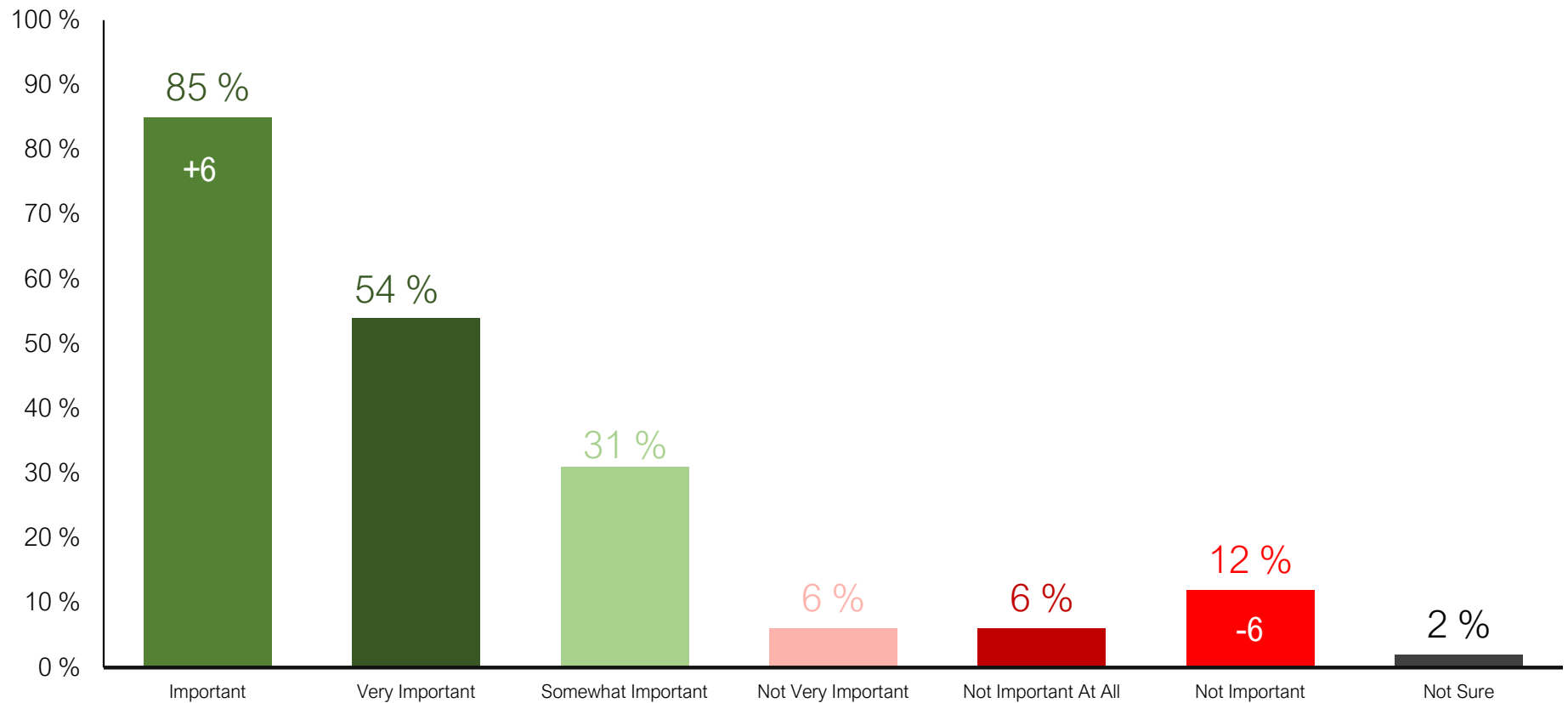

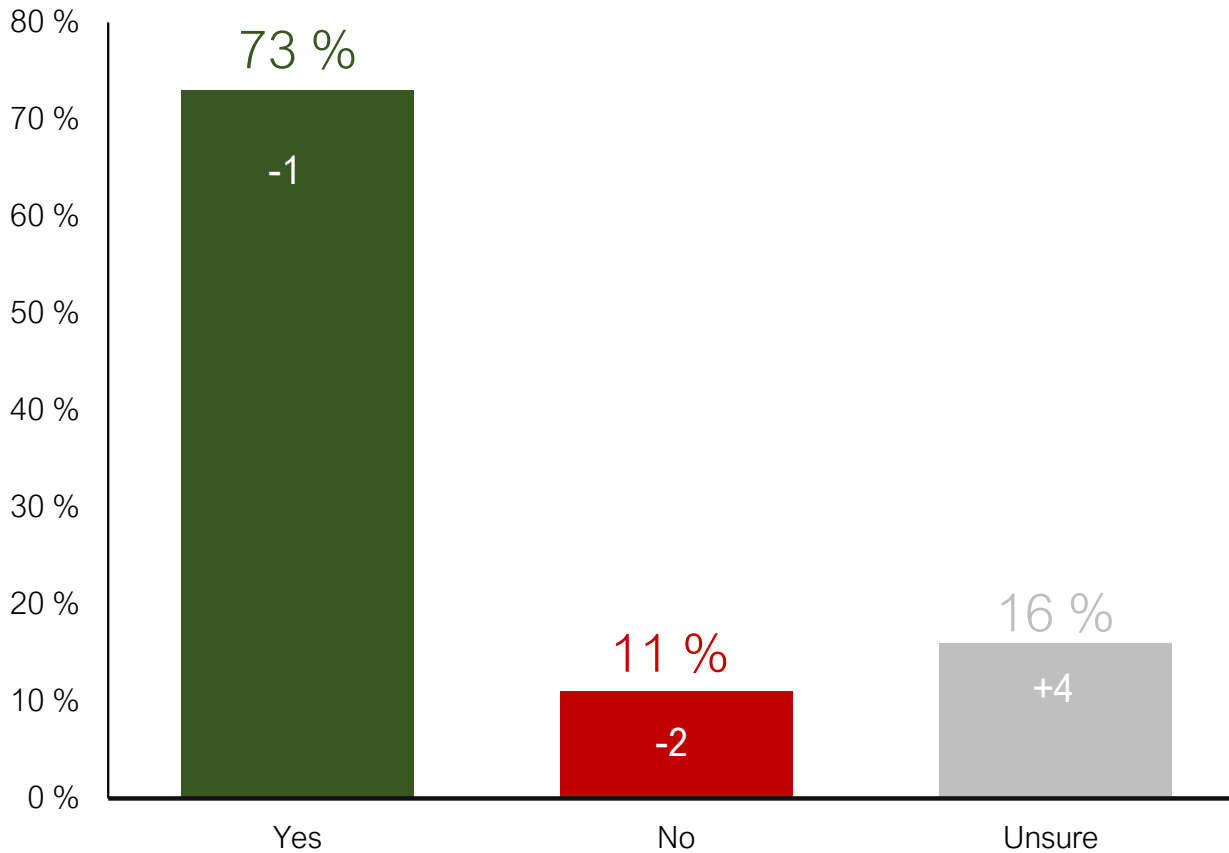
How important will energy issues be to your vote in the election?

Do you think we have the technological ability to explore for and produce natural gas and oil from offshore areas in a safe and environmentally responsible way?

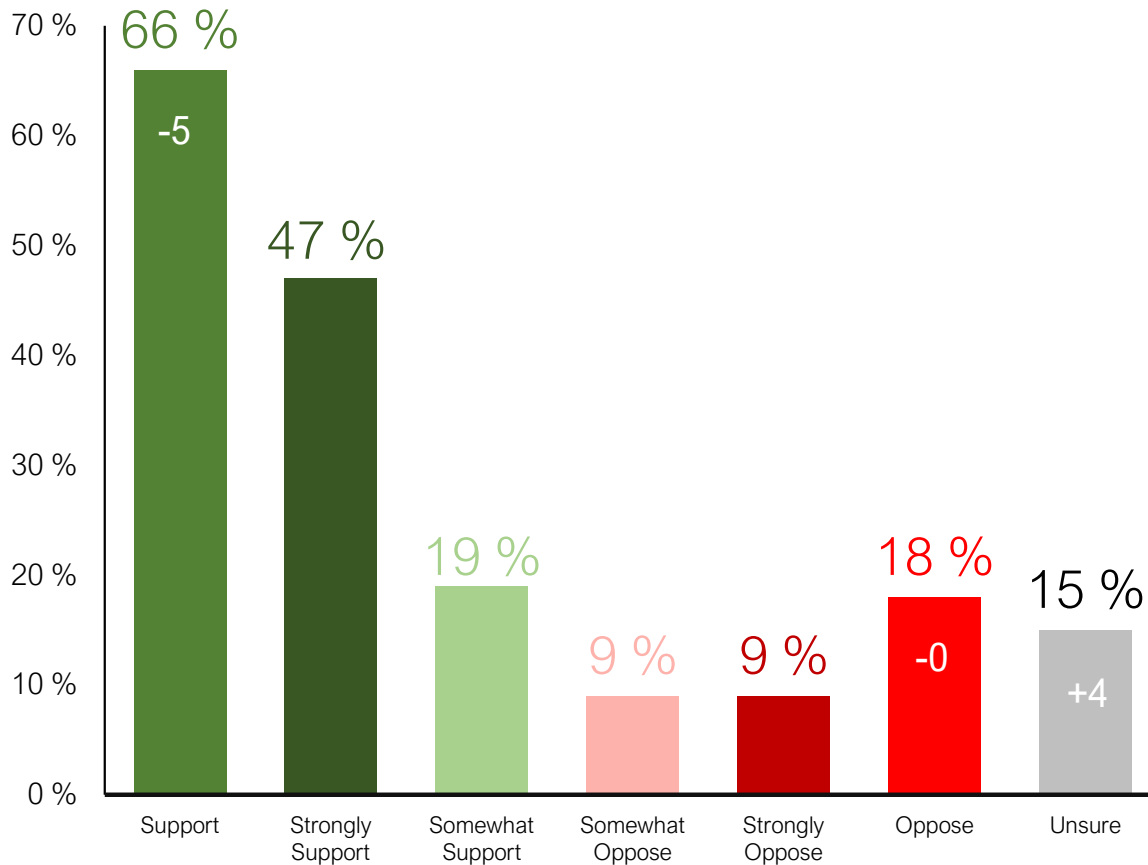

Generally speaking, do you support or oppose offshore energy exploration and production in the Gulf of Mexico?

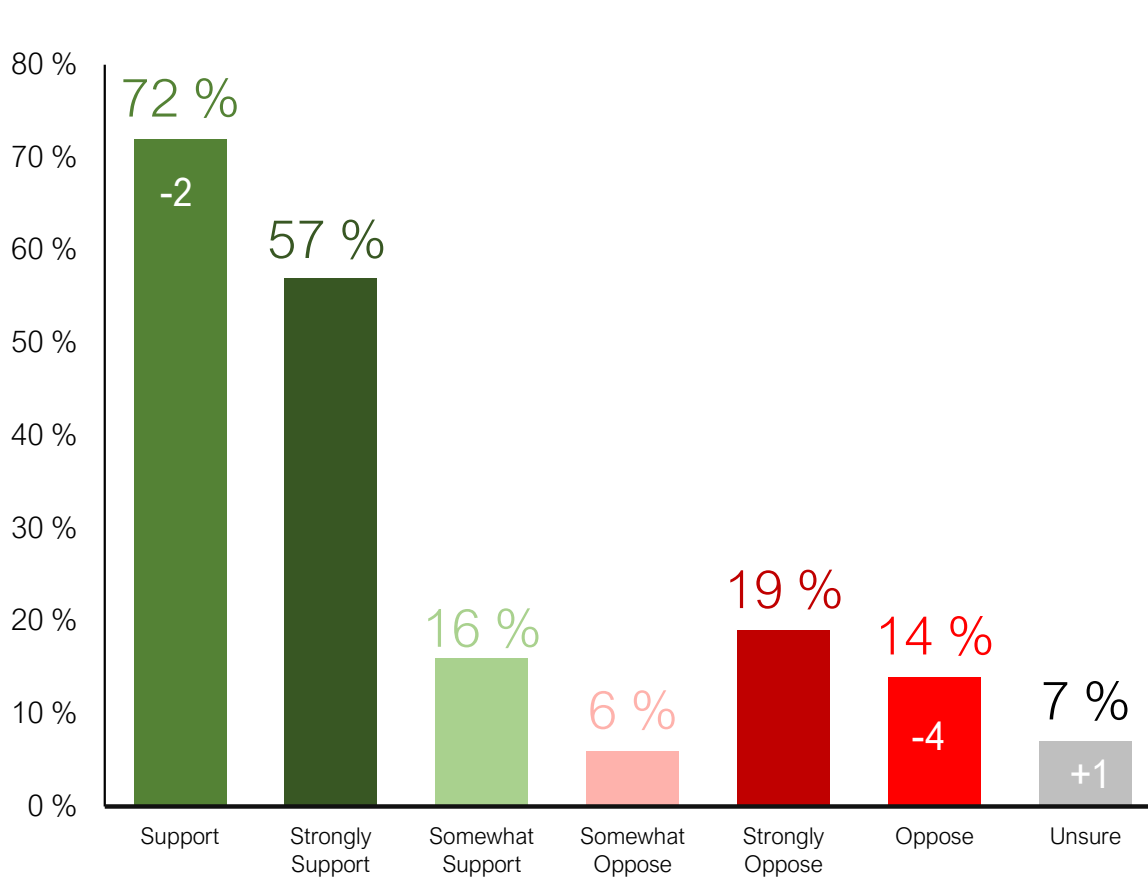

Do you support or oppose the President's call for increased development of US produced oil and natural gas?

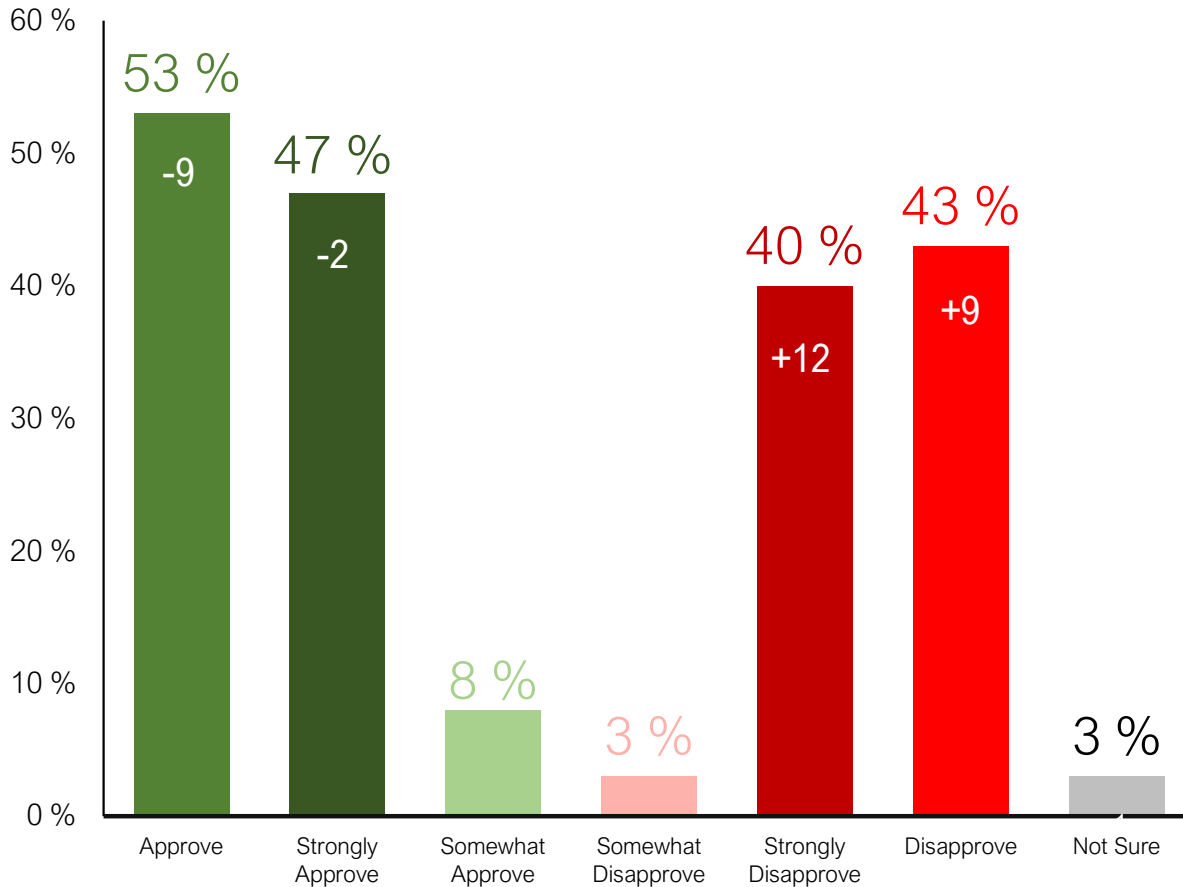

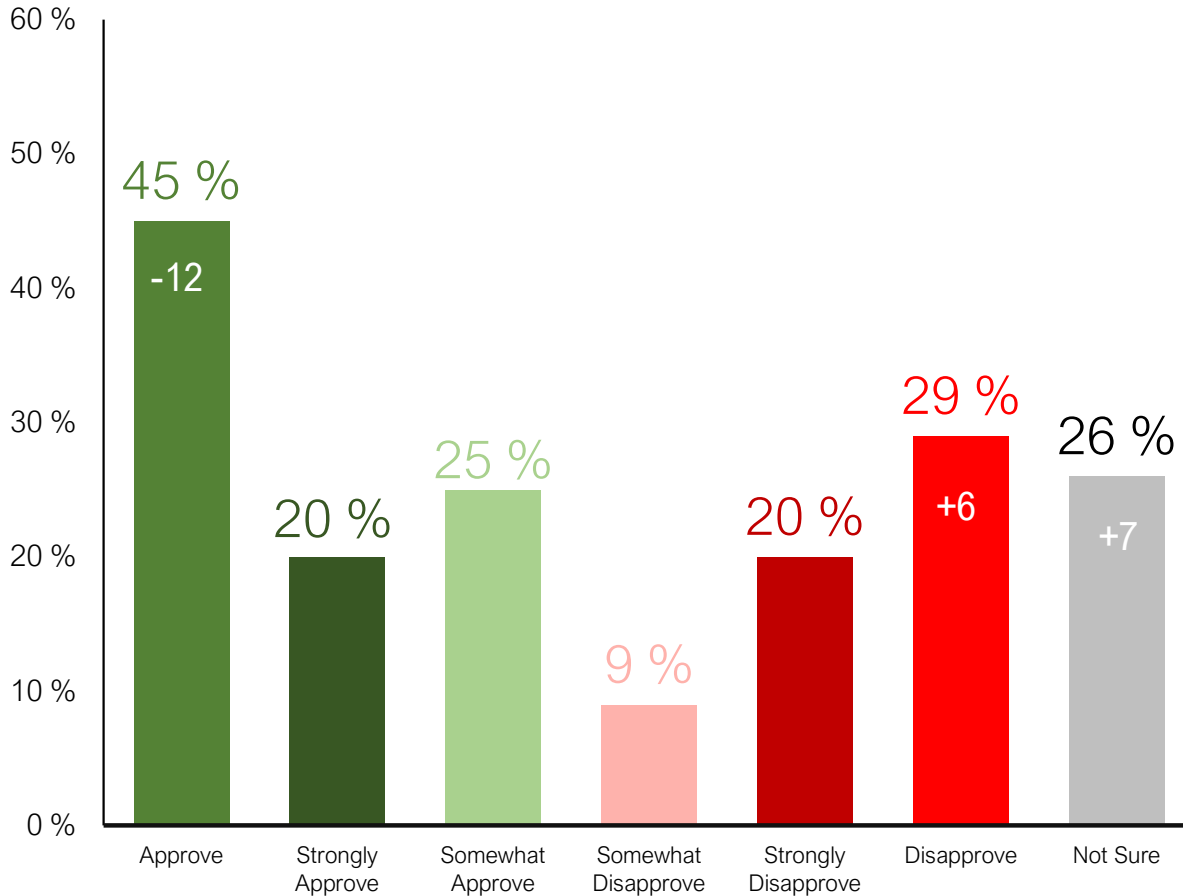

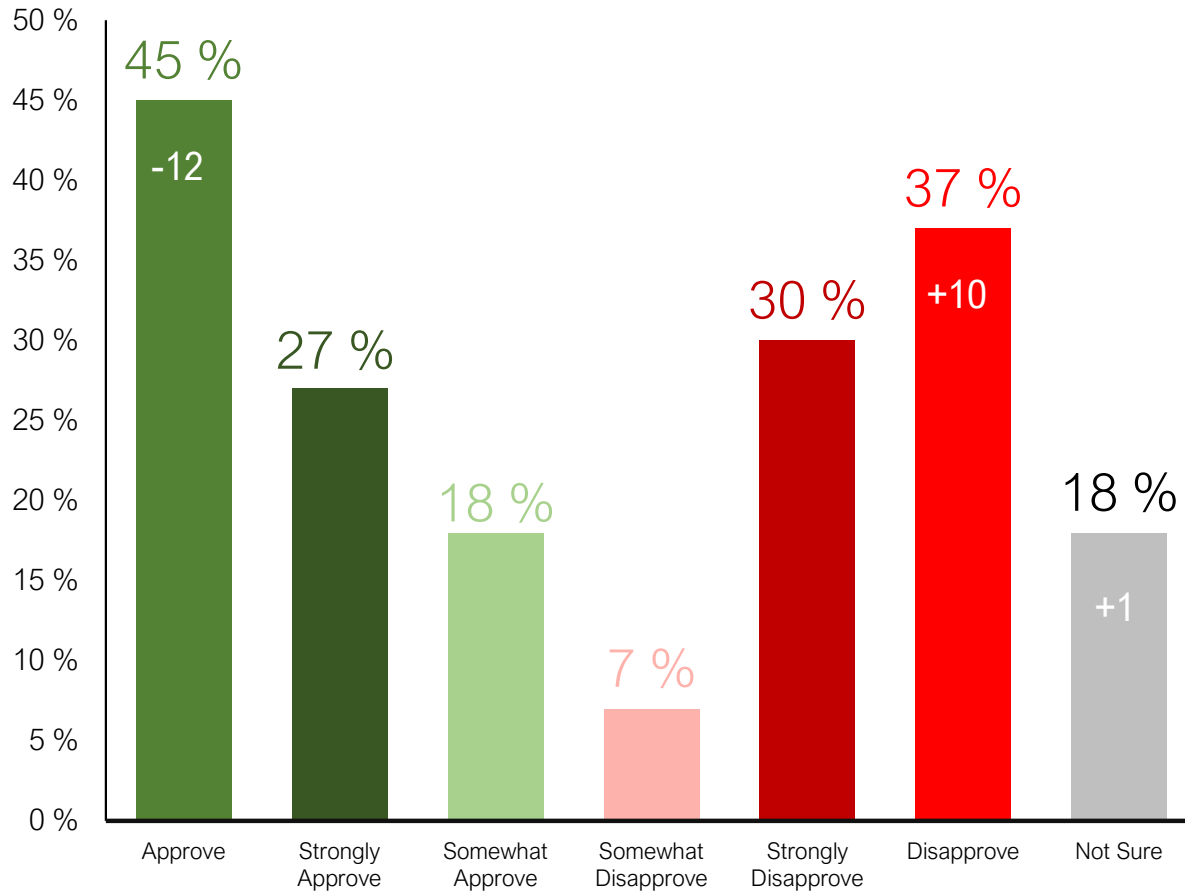

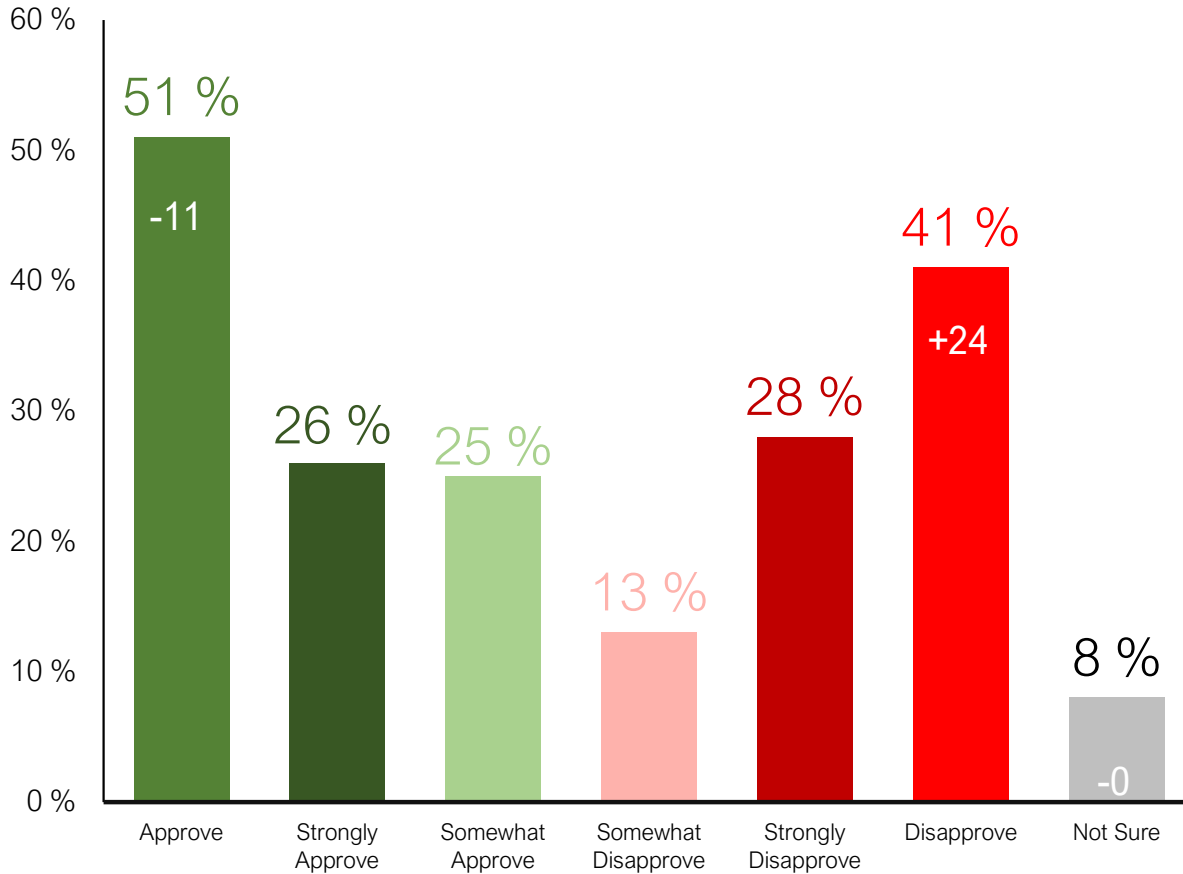

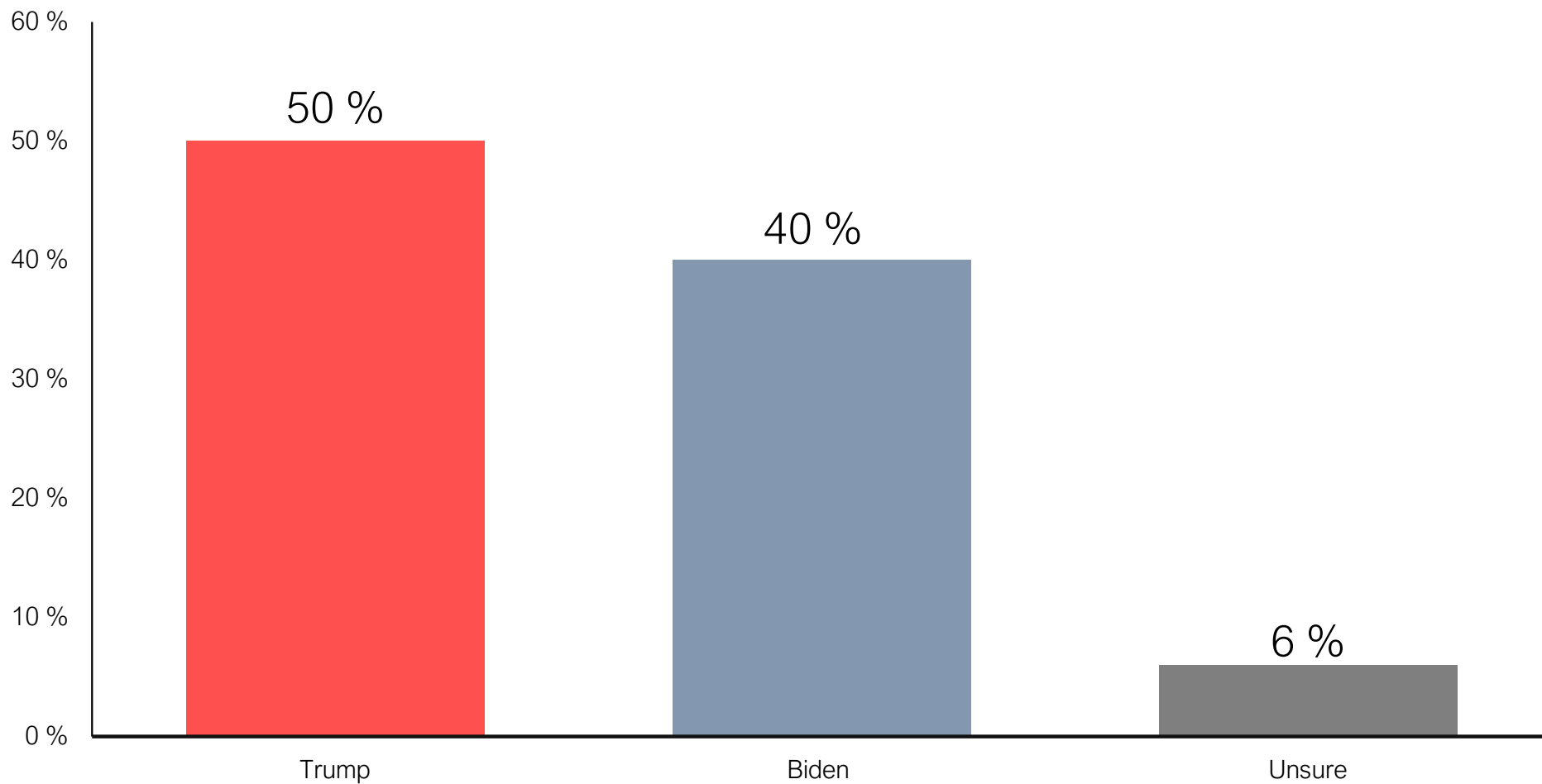

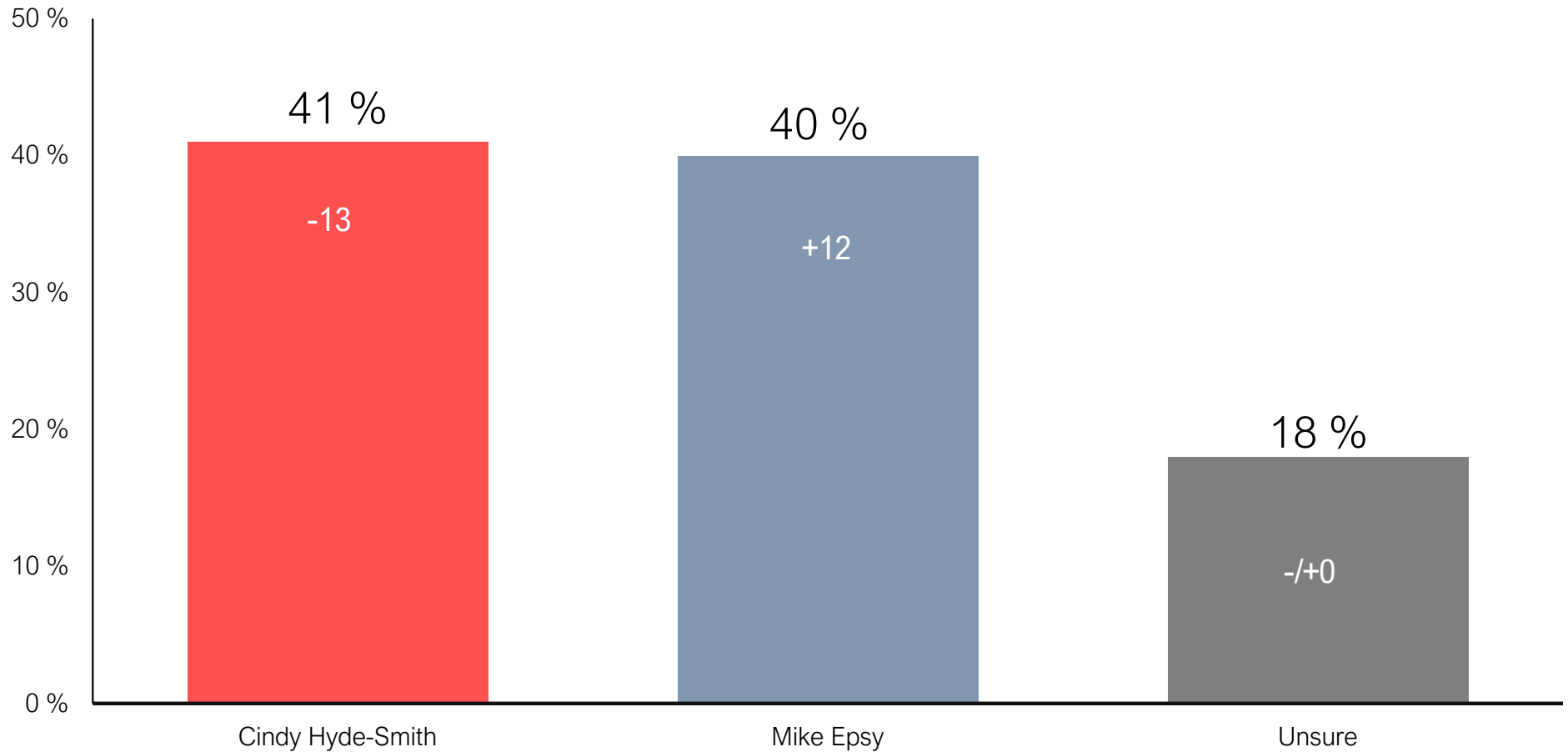
