The North Carolina CD 09 General Election Survey was conducted by IVR and Online Mobile Interviews from September 30 - October 2 among a random sample of 400 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.9 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.
