Missouri Statewide 2020 General Election


Survey conducted October 14 through October 15, 2020. 1,010 likely 2020 General Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2020 General Election. Margin of Error is +/-3% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding. 








