January 2023

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Key Findings

- Democrats are split 50-50 over whether or not President Joe Biden should seek reelection in 2024.
 - Vice President Kamala Harris is the most popular choice to run in 2024 if President Biden does not, but only 33% of Democrats believe she is the best option with 67% choosing another candidate.
- Among all Republicans, former President Trump's lead over Ron Desantis in a potential matchup in the 2024 Republican primary is the largest it has been in our polls since November with 59% of Republicans supporting Trump and only 24% supporting Desantis.
- President Biden's approval numbers remain steady in the mid 30s (35%) as more than half of people (53%) rate the economy as poor.
- In spite of these poor approval numbers, President Biden holds a 52% to 48% lead among registered voters in a potential 2024 general election matchup with former President Trump.
- 72% of respondents were at least somewhat concerned about the discovery of classified documents in President Biden's former office and residence.
 - 60% of respondents, including 57% of Democrats, support an investigation into this matter.

Methods

January 19 - January 23

n = 2,228

These results are based on responses from 2,228 Americans collected between January 19th and January 23rd via the Premise smartphone application. Premise used stratified sampling of its opt-in panel members, along with post stratification weighting based on the American Community Survey to provide a representative sample. These results are weighted by Age, Gender, Region, and Education.
