Iowa Voter Survey
October 2023

Overview

This report contains the results of a Civiqs survey of 1016 registered voters and 425 likely Republican Caucus attendees in Iowa from October 6-10, 2023. The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel. Sampled individuals were emailed by Civiqs and responded using a personalized link to the survey at civiqs.com.

Likely Republican Caucus attendees are respondents who answered that they would “Definitely” or “Probably” attend the Iowa Republican Caucuses scheduled for January 2024, in question 1, and who identified themselves as Republican or Independent on a previous Civiqs survey. An oversample of Republicans and Independents was selected to produce a larger number of likely caucus attendees.

Demographic data was collected in previous Civiqs surveys. The survey results are weighted by age, race, gender, education, party identification, and congressional district to be representative of the population of registered voters and likely Republican Caucus attendees in Iowa. The general design effect due to weighting is 1.89 for registered voters and 1.62 for likely Republican Caucus attendees, with the Republican and Independent caucus attendee oversample. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.2\%$ for registered voters and $\pm 6.1\%$ for likely Republican Caucus attendees, both at the 95% confidence level, accounting for the design effect. All survey results in this report are reported as percentages.
