RE: POWERED BY VOTERS DESIRE FOR AN OUTSIDER, SHEEHY LEADS
ROSENDALE IN MONTANA GOP PRIMARY

DATE: NOVEMBER 7, 2023

Fabrizio, Lee & Associates recently completed a statewide survey among 600 likely 2024 Montana Republican Primary Voters (RPV) (See methodology statements and key demographics on last page). We found that despite being known to significantly fewer RPV than Matt Rosendale, Tim Sheehy edges Rosendale in the GOP Primary for U.S. Senate. However, among RPV who have heard of both men and view both men favorably, it is no contest, with Sheehy up by wide margins. As Sheehy becomes more well-known to the Republican electorate of Montana as a conservative Outsider Businessman, his lead over Rosendale is likely to grow.

Montana Remains Trump Country, Crushing Competition in Presidential Primary:

The political environment among RPV in Montana is clear. They love President Trump, and against the other candidates in the Republican primary for President, he beats his next closest opponent by more than 5-to-1. Trump wins 64% of the vote, compared to 12% for DeSantis, 7% for Haley, and 3% or less for all the other candidates.

Rosendale is Universally Known, while Sheehy is Very Popular with those Aware of Him:

Tim Sheehy has a 5-to-1 favorable image among those with an opinion of him, though 21% have never heard of him and another 24% have no opinion of him. Conversely, Matt Rosendale is basically universally known, with 9-in-10 voters having a hard opinion of him. Among these voters, 66% have a favorable opinion and 24% have an unfavorable opinion of Rosendale.

Montana RPV want to Elect an Outsider instead of a Long-Time Politician:

By a huge margin, Montana RPV prefer a successful businessperson who is a political outsider over an elected official who has been a political insider for more than a dozen years, 76% - 8%. Given this desire, it is not surprising that those who know enough about Tim Sheehy to have an opinion are so favorable toward him. He embodies that type of candidate they want to send to the U.S. Senate.

Sheehy Leads Despite Name ID Disadvantage; Wins Big with Those Aware of Both Candidates:

Among all Montana RPV, Tim Sheehy leads Matt Rosendale by 3-points both on the full ballot, 38% - 35%, and on the head-to-head ballot, 44% - 41%. However, when we “level the playing field” and look at RPV who are aware of both candidates, Sheehy leads Rosendale by 19 on the full ballot, 47% - 28%, and by 18 on the head-to-head ballot, 52% - 34%. Furthermore, among those with a favorable opinion of both candidates, Sheehy wins overwhelmingly, getting two-thirds of the vote, compared to less than 30% for Rosendale on both ballots. If voters like both candidates, Sheehy wins in a runaway.

Bottom Line: Sheehy appears to have taken command of this race despite Rosendale having superior name ID. As Sheehy continues to increase his name ID and become positively known as a successful businessman and political outsider to the Montana RPV electorate, his lead should continue to increase.

(= Mygland dropped out of race on first night of interviewing and was removed from ballot question for subsequent nights)*

METHODOLOGY STATEMENT: Fabrizio, Lee & Associates conducted a survey of 600 voters in Montana who are likely to vote in the 2024 Republican Primary, from October 23-25, 2023. The interviews were split 30% live-operator landline/35% live-operator cell/35% SMS to web. Geography was matched to votes cast in previous GOP primaries in Montana. Gender, age, race/ethnicity, party affiliation, and education were matched to demographic profiles of likely voters based on the voter file, AP VoteCast, and exit poll data. Respondents were randomly selected from lists of known previous GOP primary voters and newly registered voters eligible to vote. The margin of sampling error at the 95% confidence interval is $\pm 4.00\%$.
