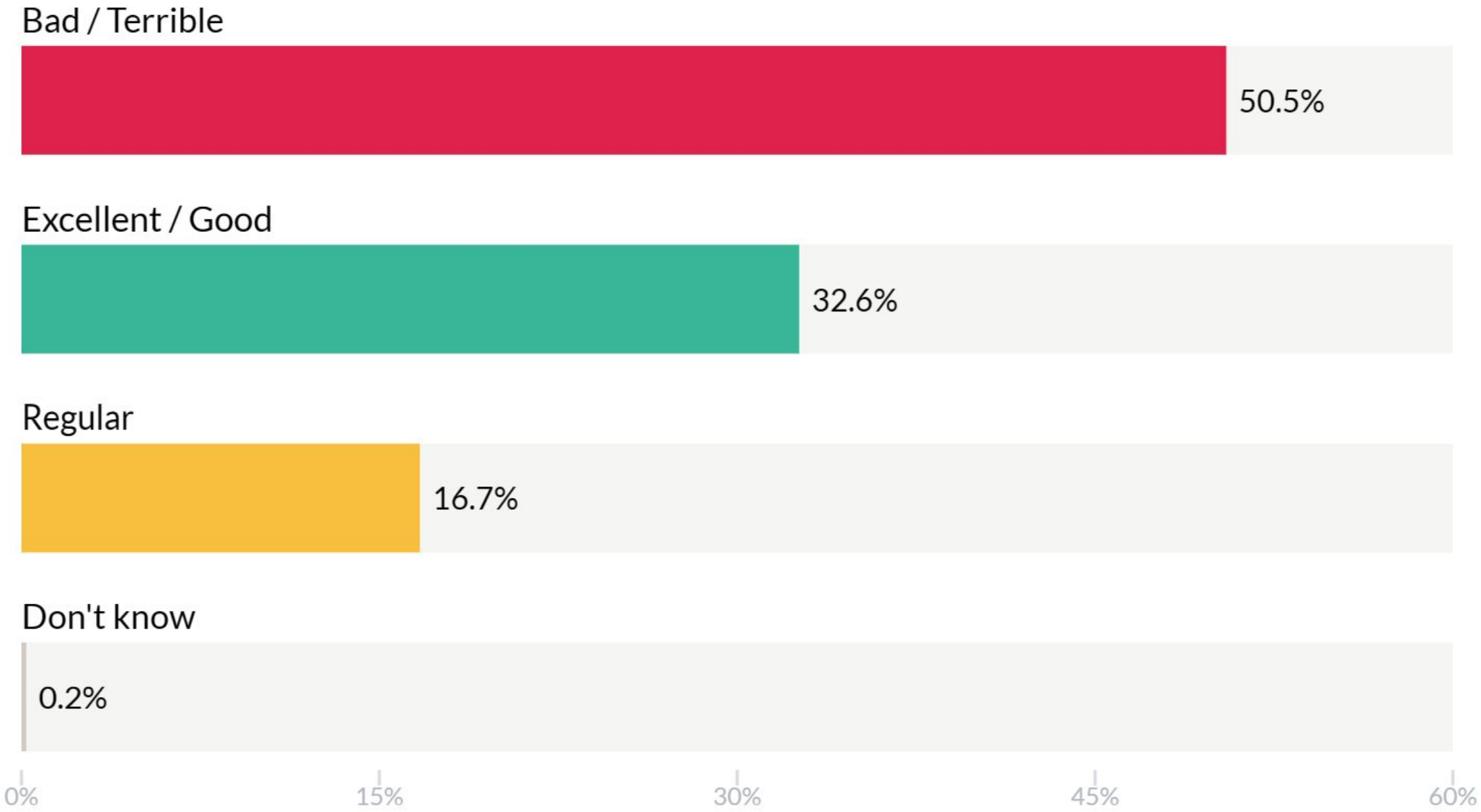

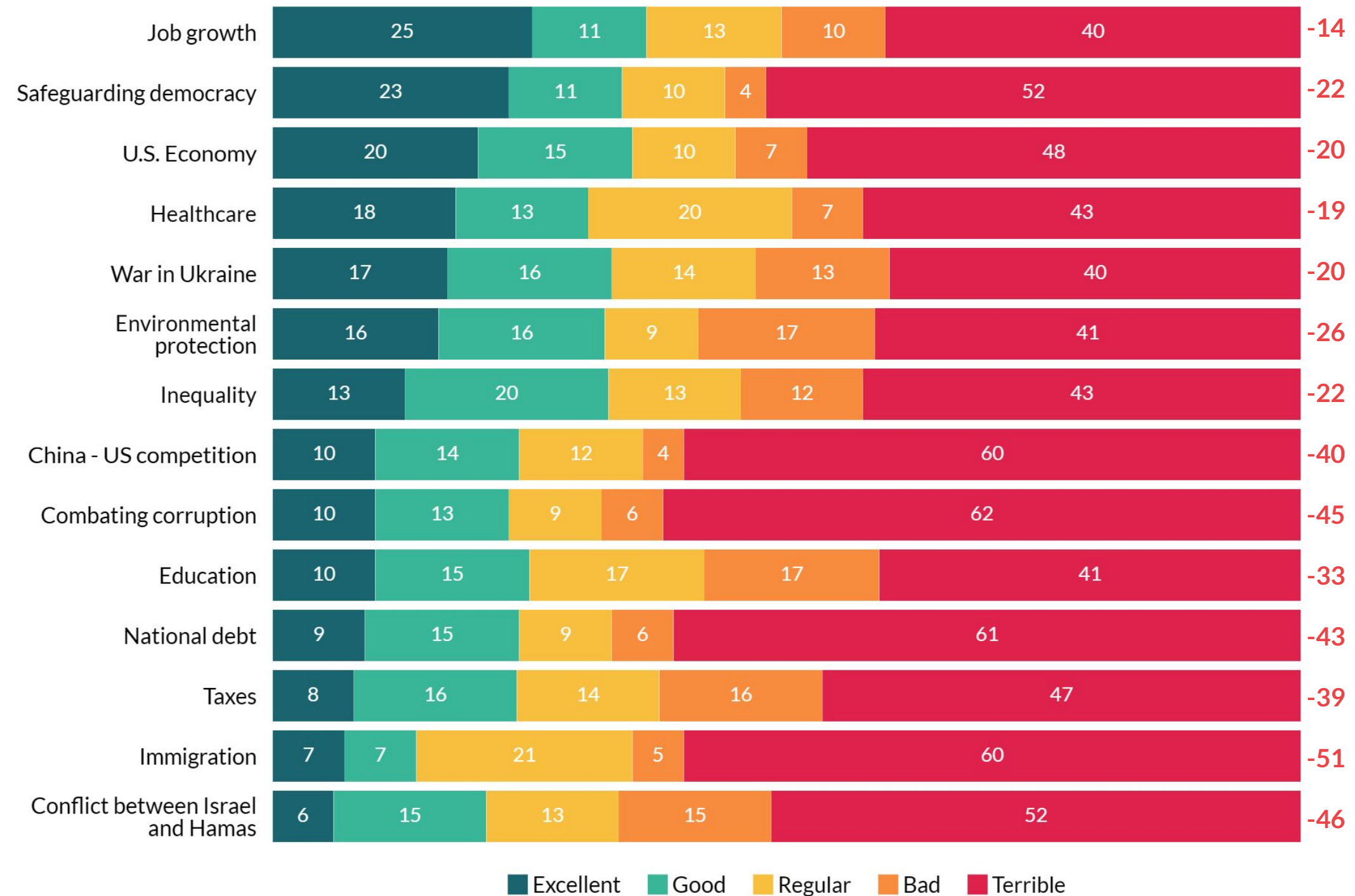

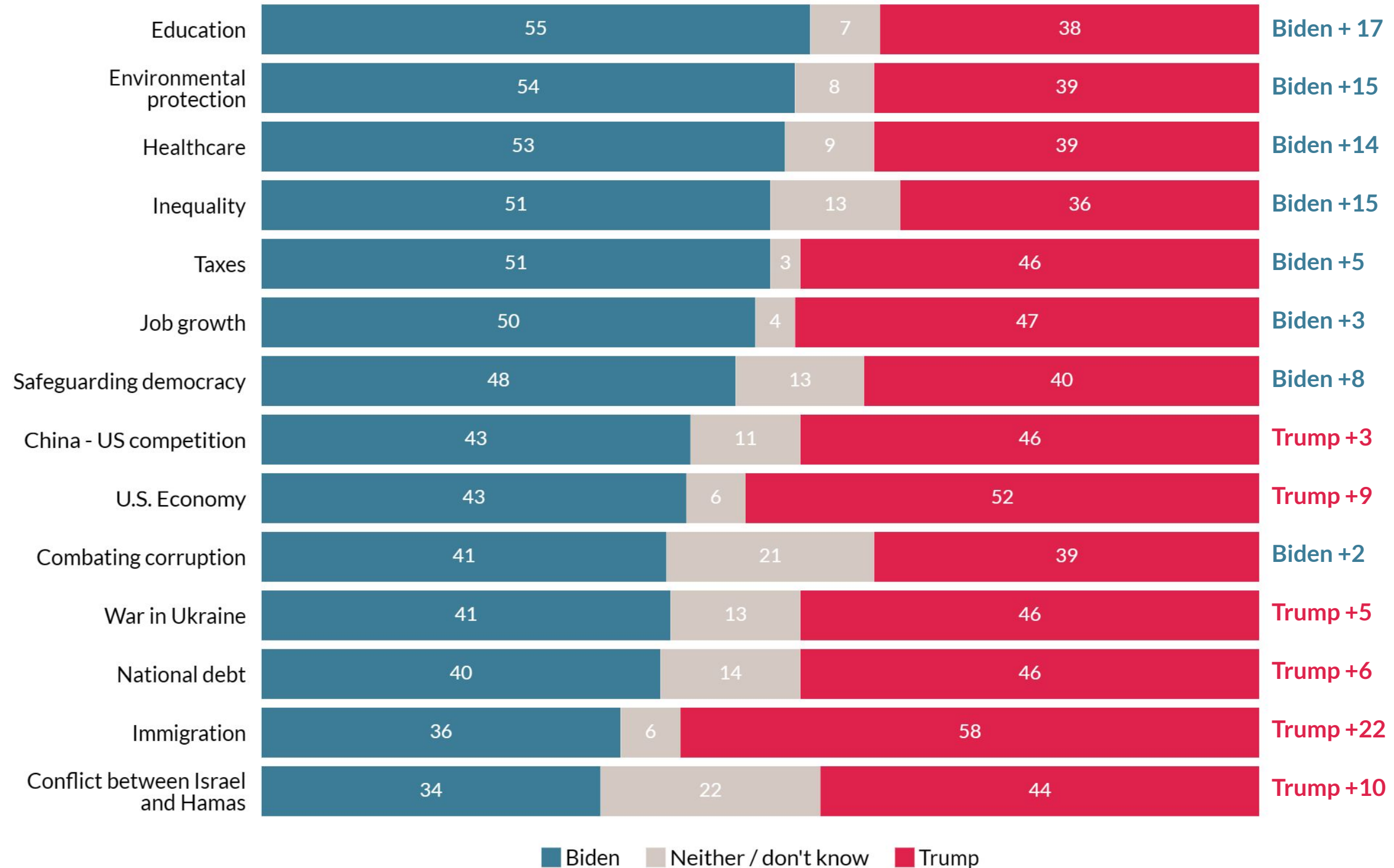

How would you qualify President Biden's handling of the following issues?

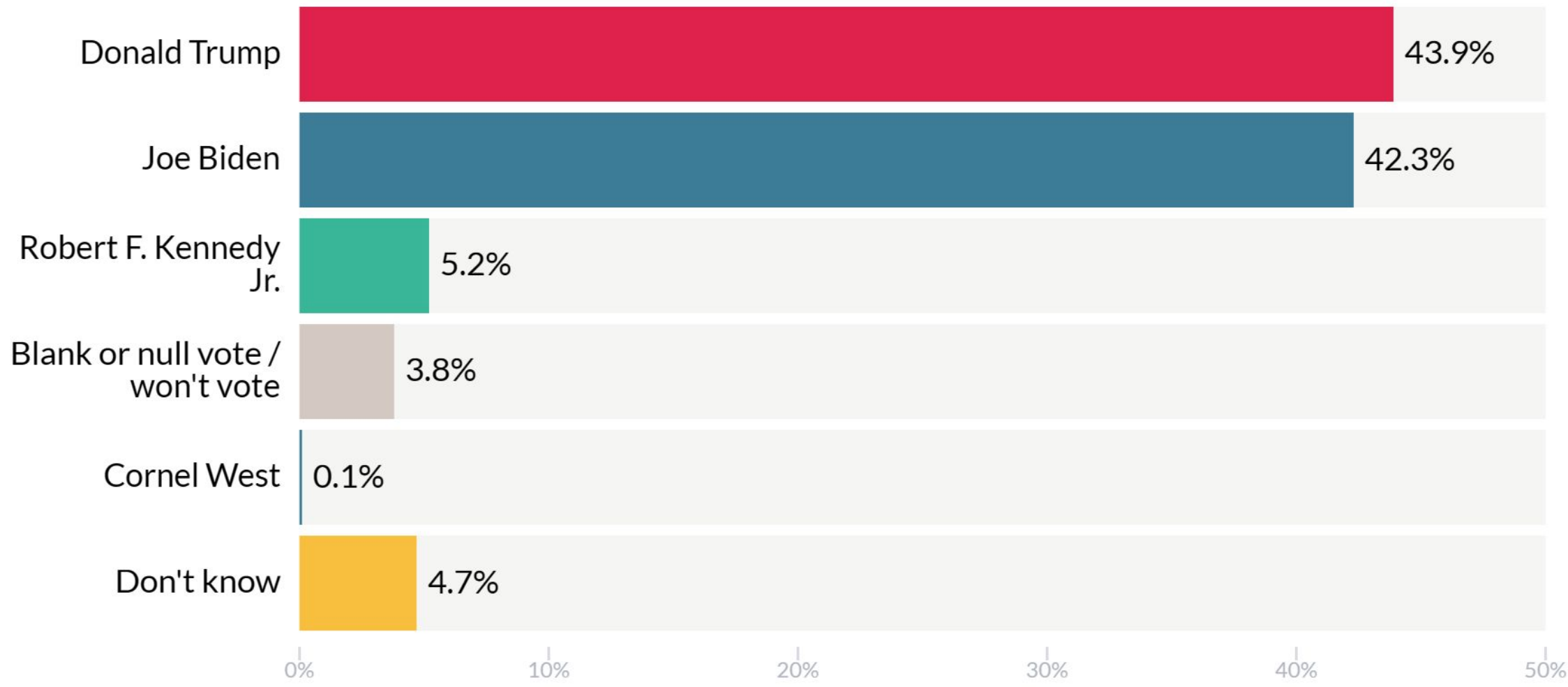


Between Trump and Biden, whom do you trust more to deal with each of the following topics?

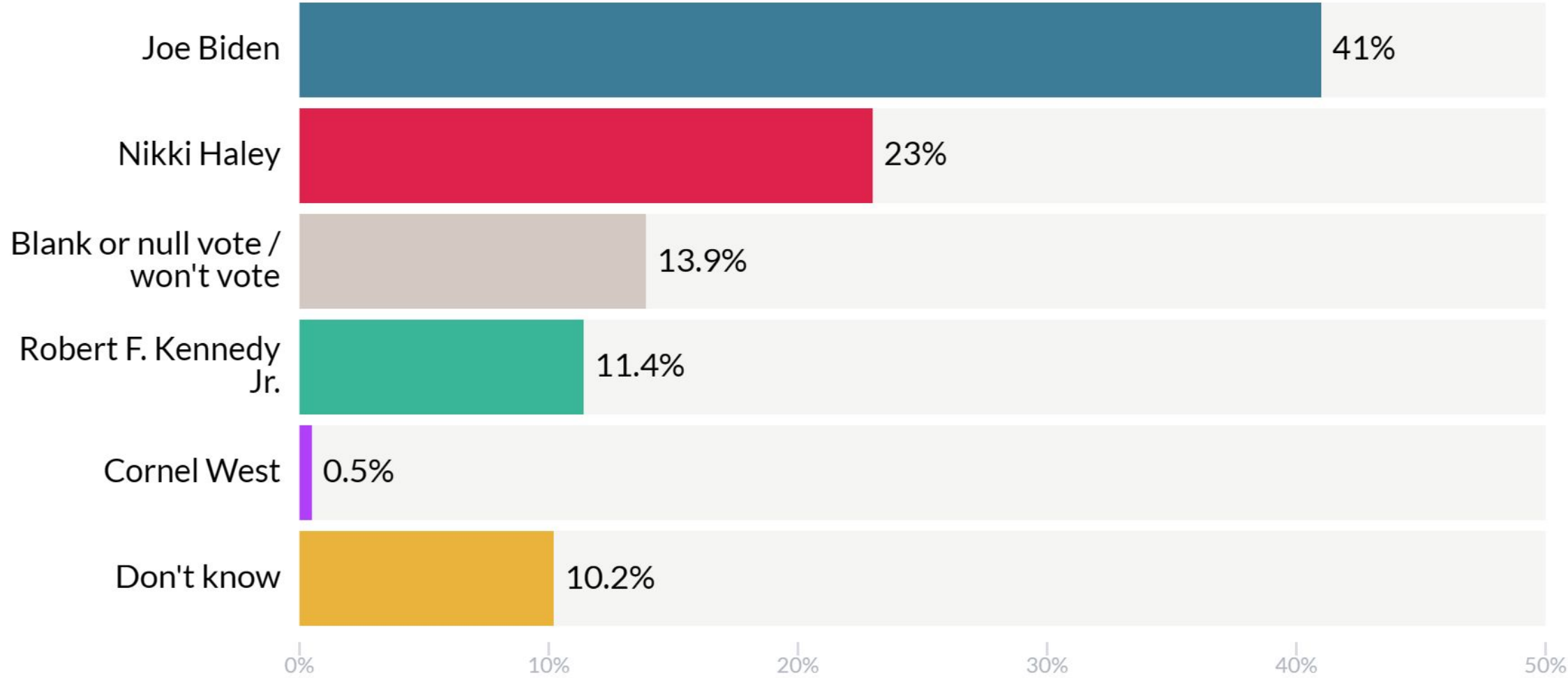

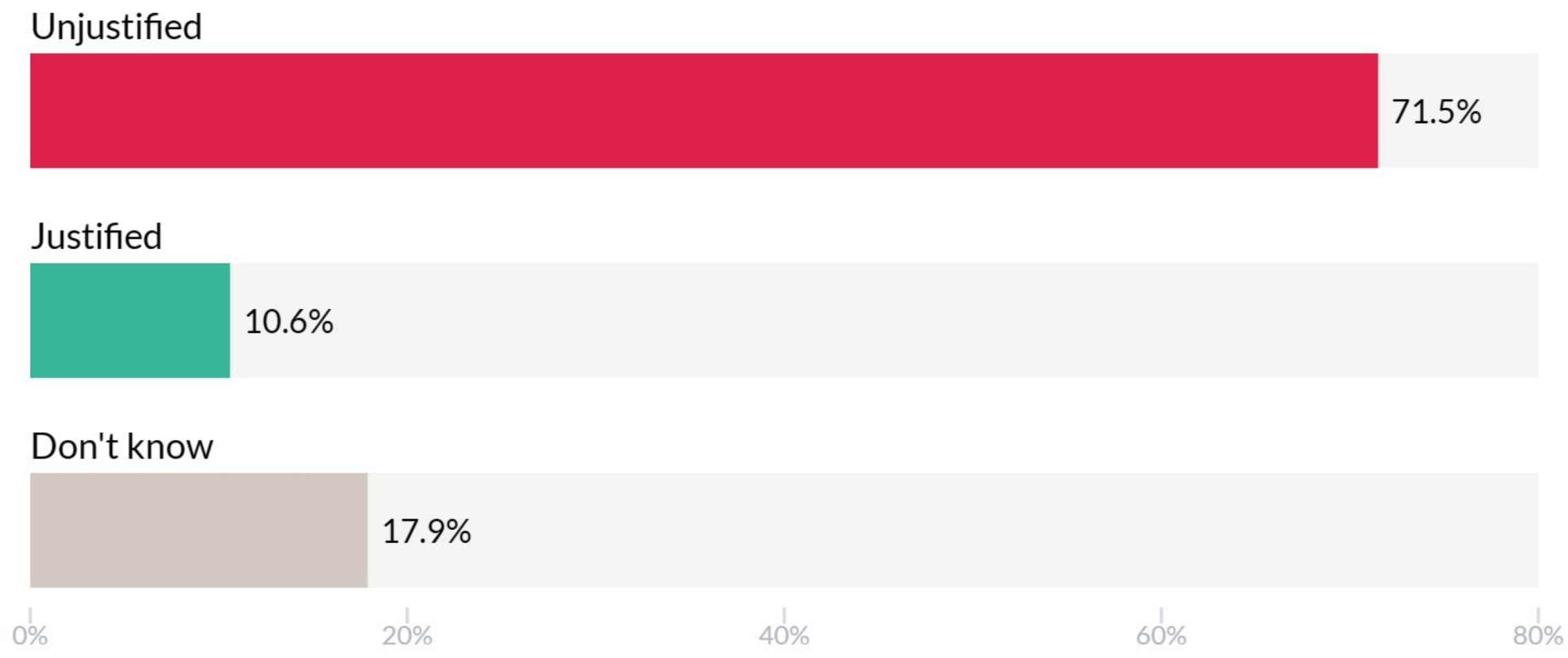

In your opinion, was the January 6th 2021 invasion of the US Capitol justified or unjustified?

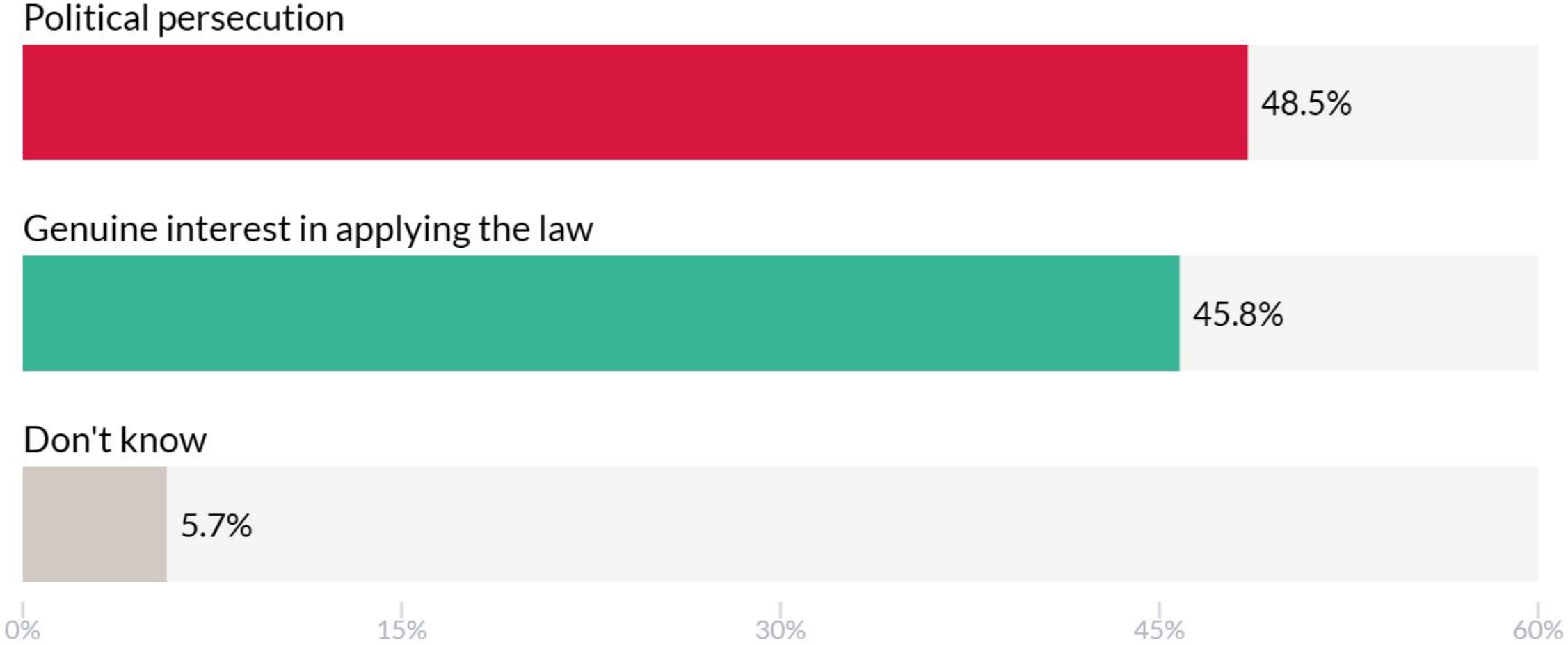

In your opinion, are the current judicial proceedings against Donald Trump motivated mainly by political persecution or a genuine interest in applying the law?

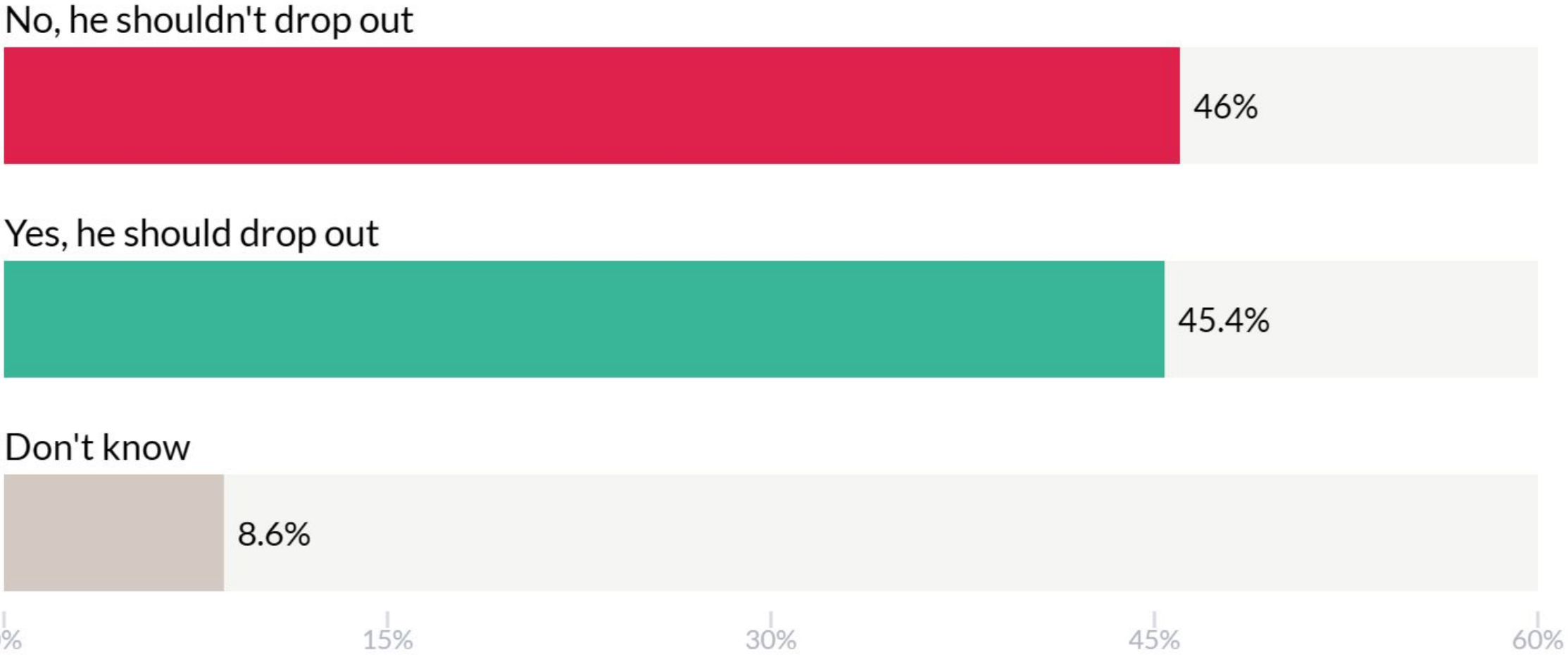

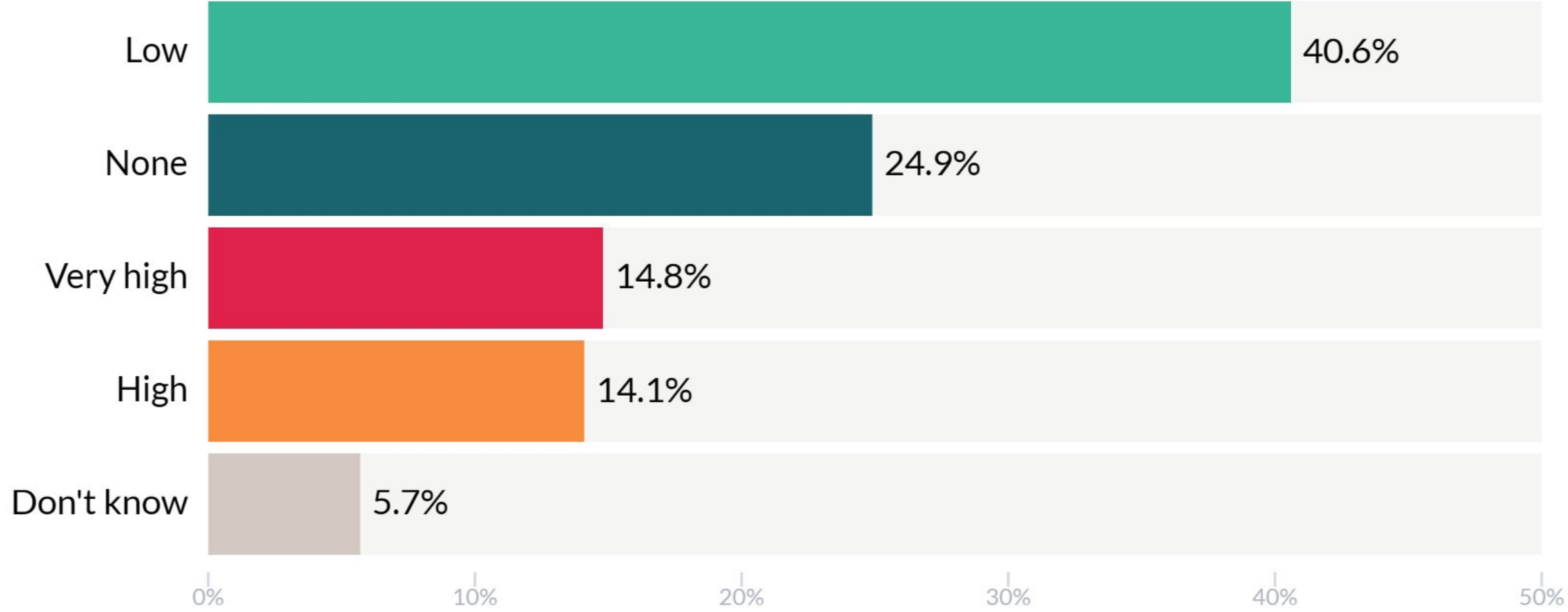

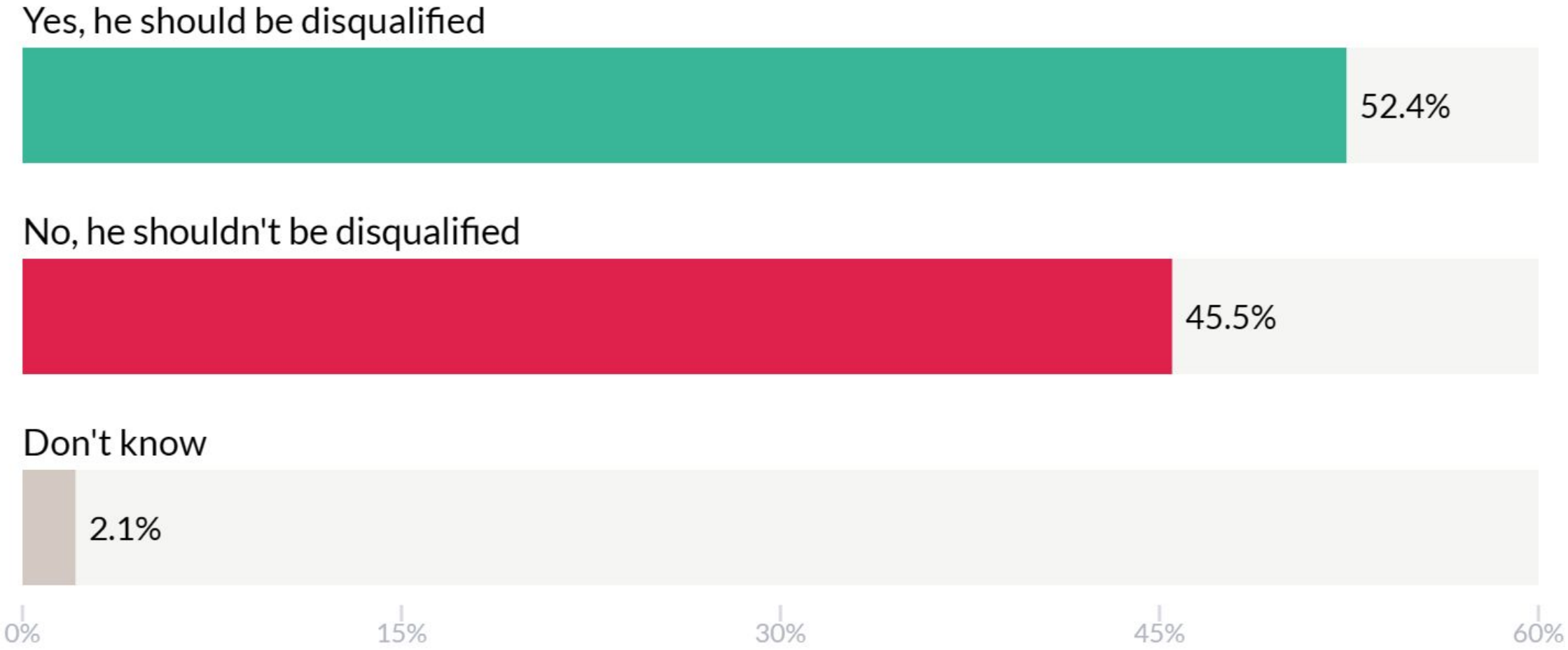

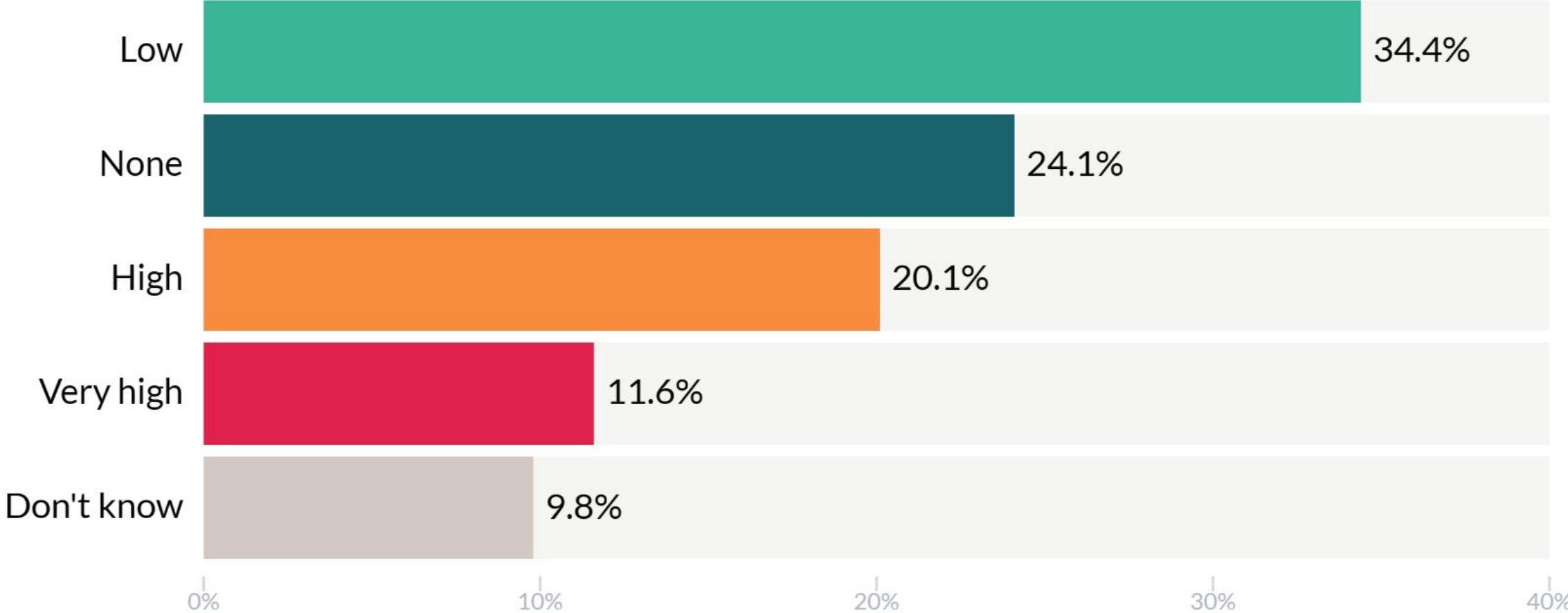

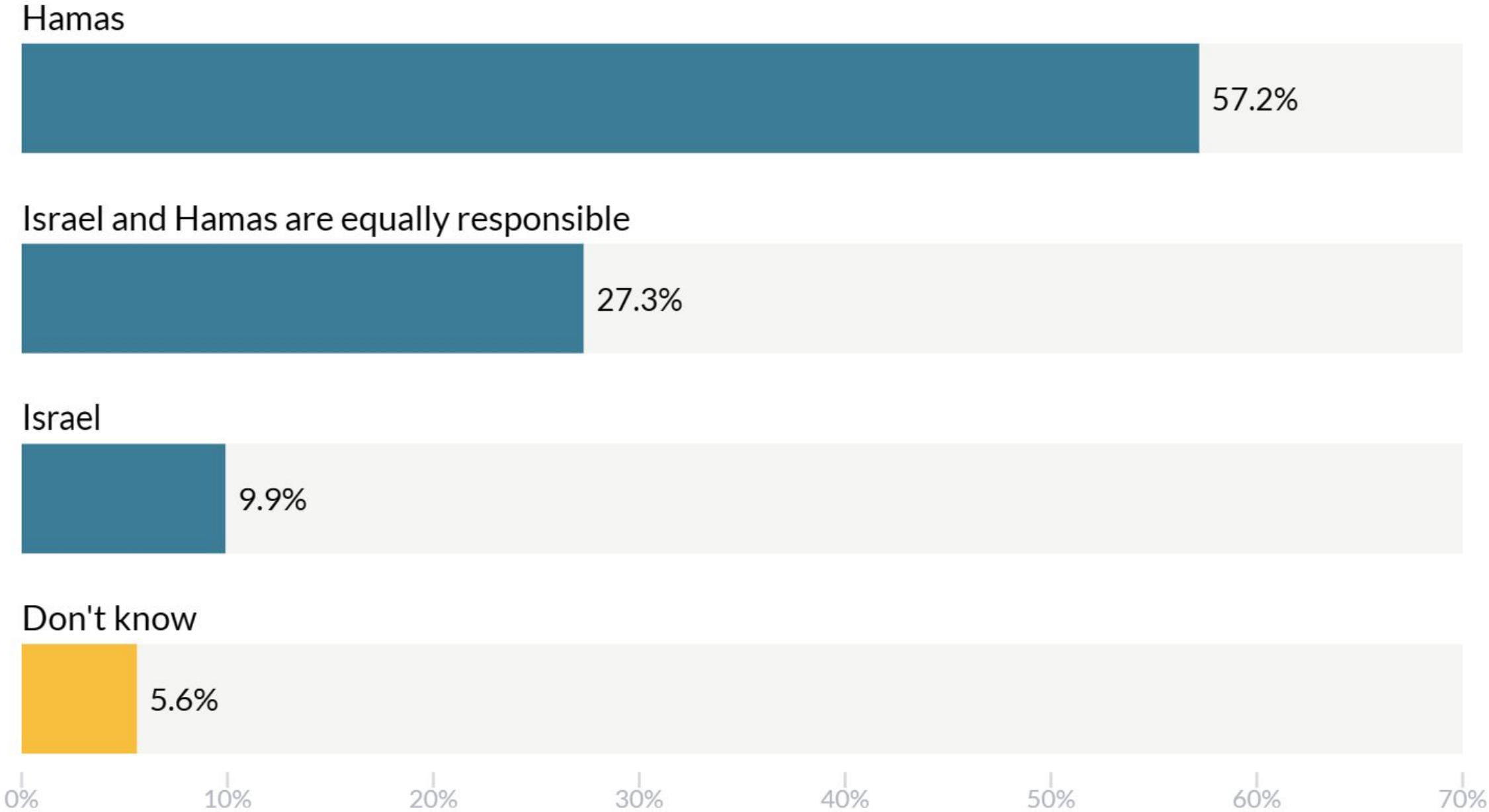

In your opinion, who is the main culprit for the current armed conflict between Israel and Hamas in Gaza?



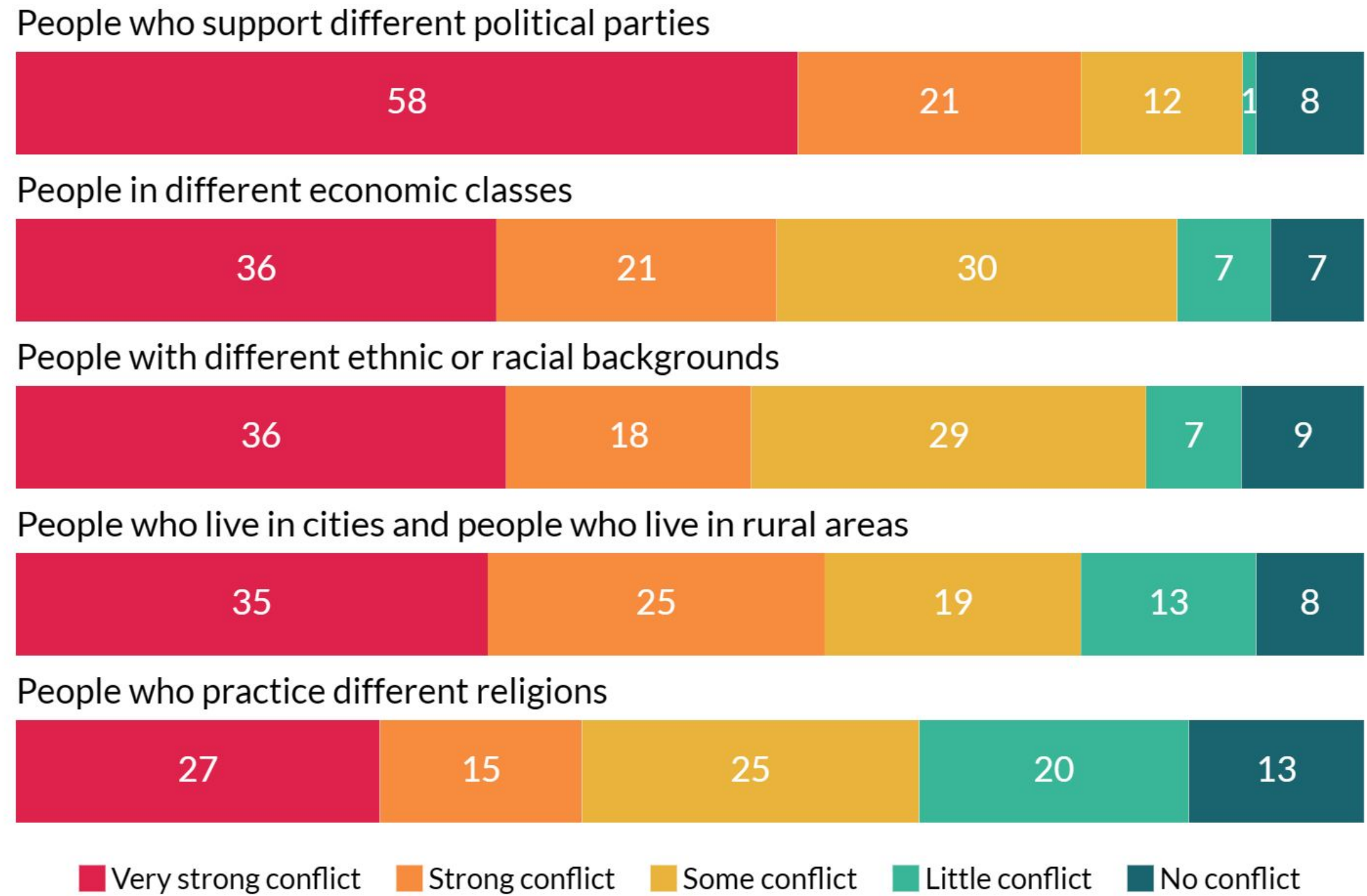

Social Polarization in the United States [Demographic crossings]

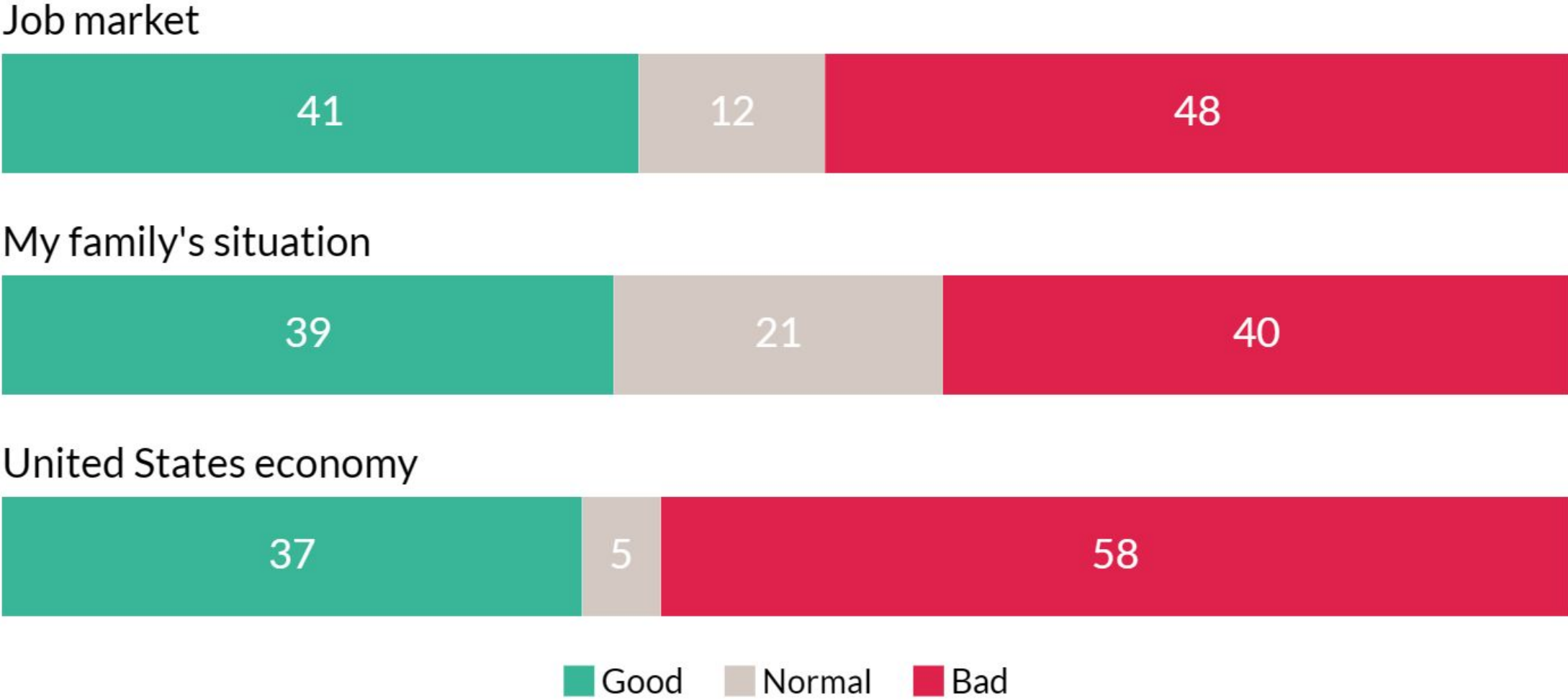

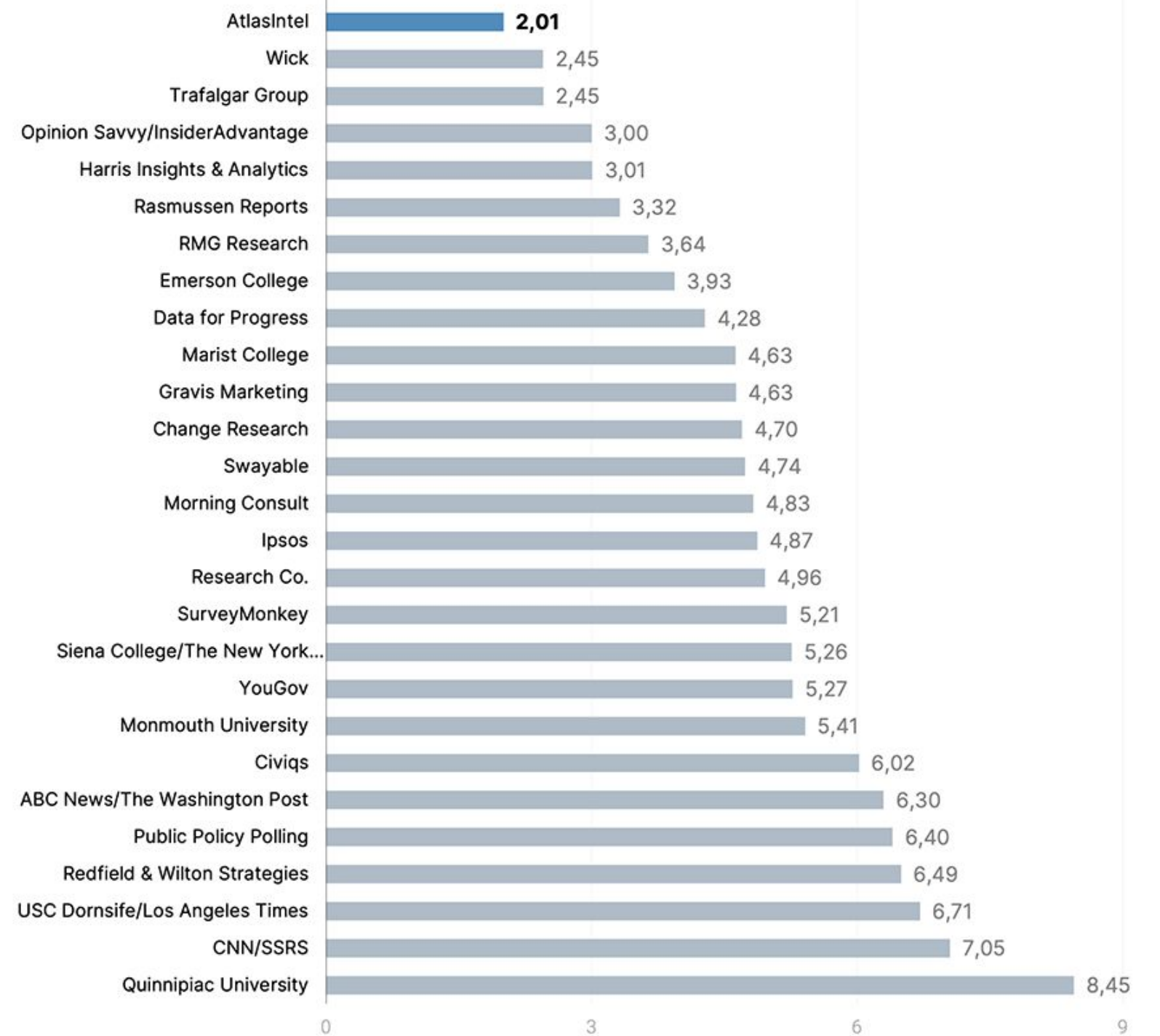

Public and private AtlasIntel polls accurately captured the dynamics of voter mobilization and came closer to the final vote count than any competitor.

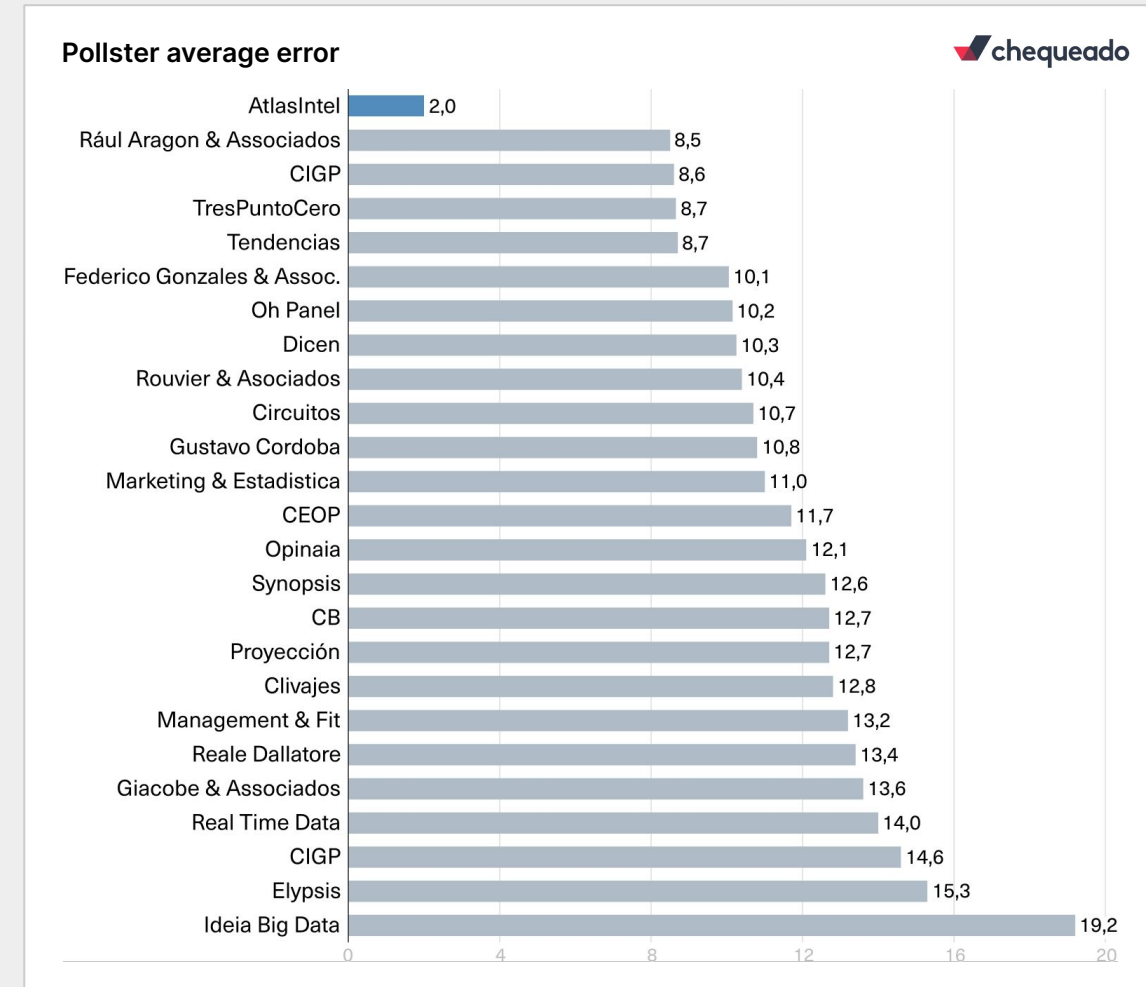

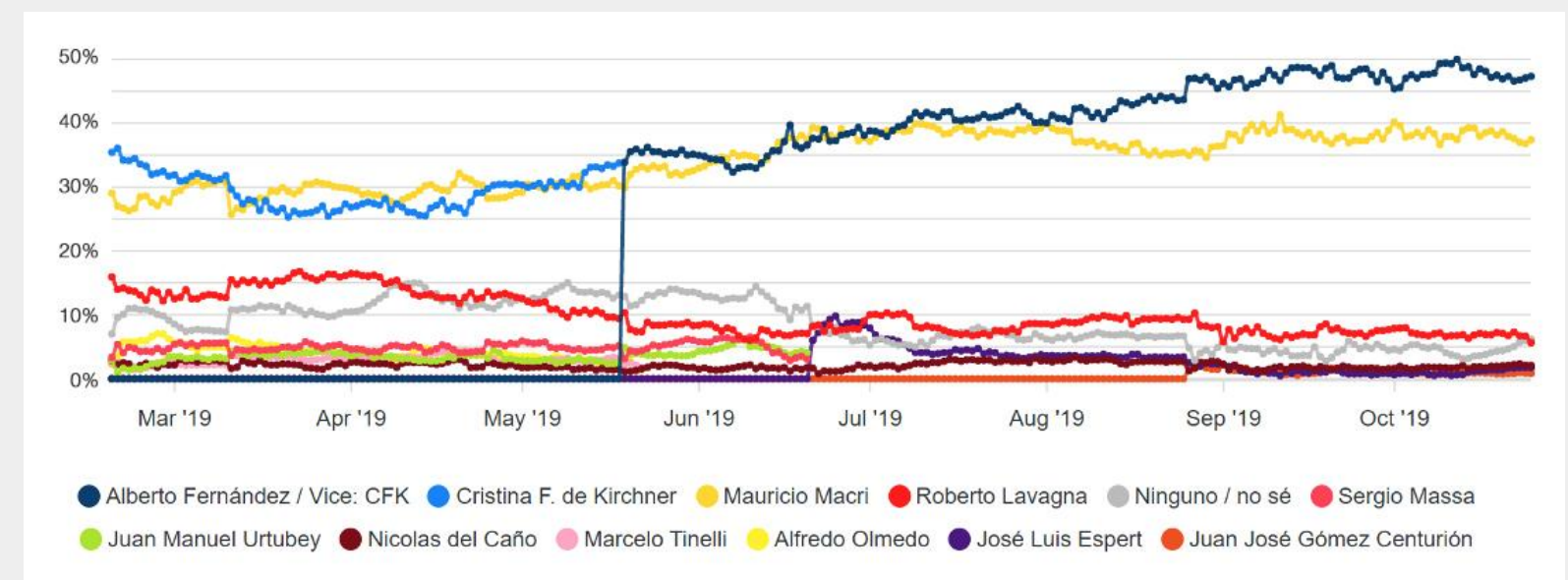
