[SPLIT A] [BUSINESSMAN] Joe Salerno is a lifelong New Jerseyan with a work ethic he got from his dad, a World War II POW. Joe learned the value of the dollar pumping gas at a local service station. He went on to become an engineer and started successful businesses that created good paying jobs here in New Jersey. Now Joe is running for Congress to bring order to Washington and make life in New Jersey more affordable. He'll do what the extremists and career politicians have failed to do: restore the SALT tax deduction so our taxes are lower and defend abortion rights.

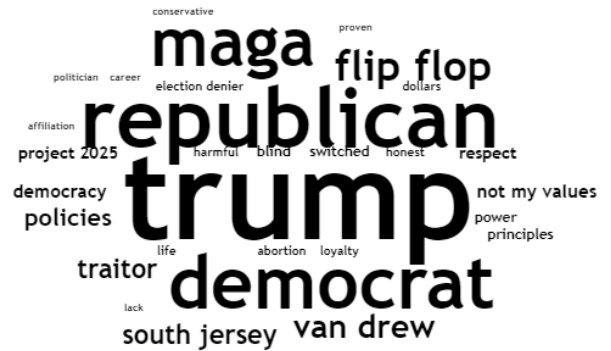
